Entry and Exit

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Unilateral Visa-Free Policy

As of September 2025, holders of ordinary passports from the following 47 countries could enter China without a visa for business, tourism, visiting relatives and friends, and transit for no more than 30 days.

Visa-Free Transit Policy

24-Hour Visa-Free Transit Policy

All open exit-entry ports in China implement a 24-hour visa-free transit policy for nationals of all other countries around the world.

In line with global norms, China has implemented a 24-hour visa-free transit policy for foreign nationals from all other countries around the world at all of its accessible exit-entry ports. Foreign nationals holding valid international travel documents and interline tickets with confirmed seats, who intend to transit via China by international flights, ships, or trains to third countries or regions, are exempt from visa applications, provided that their stay periods in China will not exceed 24 hours and that they will remain within the corresponding ports. Those who plan to leave the ports shall apply for temporary entry permits at the exit-entry border inspection authorities of the corresponding ports.

240-Hour Visa-Free Transit Policy

As of June 2025, 60 open ports to the outside world in 24 provinces (autonomous regions, and municipalities directly under the Central Government) of China will implement a 240-hour transit visa exemption policy for nationals of 55 countries. Holders of valid international travel documents and interline tickets with confirmed dates and seats within a specified time frame may apply for transit visa exemption at the exit-entry border inspection authorities of Chinese cities designated for this policy. Upon approval, they will be granted temporary entry procedures, with the 240-hour visa-free period calculated from 00:00 hours on the day following entry. During their stay, visa-free transit travelers may engage in activities such as tourism, business visits, sightseeing, or family reunions, while those requiring prior authorization (e.g., work, study, press interviews) must obtain the relevant visas before entering China.

Regional Visa-Free Entry Policy

30-Day Visa-Free Entry Policy for Personnel from 59 Countries to Hainan

Foreign nationals holding ordinary passports from 59 countries may enter and stay within the administrative region of Hainan Province for a maximum of 30 days without a visa for short-term stays for purposes associated with tourism, business, visits, family visits, medical treatment, conferences and exhibitions, sports competitions, etc. The exit-entry ports for the foreign nationals concerned include all the open ports in Hainan.

Visa-free Policy for Tourist Groups from ASEAN Countries Entering Guilin, Guangxi and Xishuangbanna, Yunnan

The tourist groups from the 10 member states (Malaysia, Indonesia, Thailand, the Philippines, Singapore, Brunei, Vietnam, Laos, Myanmar, and Cambodia) of ASEAN, which are organized and received by qualified travel agencies in China, can enter and exit China without visas via Guilin Liangjiang International Airport in Guangxi Zhuang Autonomous Region. Tourists in this case are restricted to the city of Guilin, and their stay periods must not exceed the maximum allotted time of 144 hours.

The tourist groups from the 10 member states (Malaysia, Indonesia, Thailand, the Philippines, Singapore, Brunei, Vietnam, Laos, Myanmar, and Cambodia) of ASEAN, which are organized and received by qualified travel agencies in China, can enter and exit China without visas via Xishuangbanna Gasa International Airport in Yunnan Province, Mohan Railway Port, and Mohan Port in Guizhou Province. Tourists in this case are restricted to the administrative area of Xishuangbanna Prefecture, Yunnan Province, and their stay periods must not exceed the maximum allotted time of 144 hours.

144-Hour Visa-free Policy for Foreign Tourist Groups from Hong Kong and Macao Entering Guangdong

Foreign nationals as part of tourist groups organized by travel agencies based in Hong Kong SAR and Macao SAR, who are holding ordinary passports and traveling to the nine mainland cities of the Greater Bay Area and Shantou, can stay up to a maximum of 144 hours without visas. Their stay is limited to the following cities: Guangzhou, Foshan, Zhaoqing, Shenzhen, Dongguan, Huizhou, Zhuhai, Zhongshan, Jiangmen, and Shantou. They must enter and exit China through an open port in one of these ten cities together with their groups, and their stay periods must not exceed the maximum allotted time of 144 hours.



144-Hour Visa-Free Policy for Foreign Tourist Groups from Hong Kong and Macao entering Hainan

Foreign nationals holding ordinary passports from countries with diplomatic relations with China may enter Hainan Province without a visa, provided that they will enter Hong Kong or Macao SAR first and then enter Hainan Province as part of a tourist group organized by a travel agency registered in any of the two SARs. The tourists concerned shall enter and exit Hainan Province as part of their tourist group via any of the exit-entry ports in Hainan and can stay for a maximum of 144 hours.

Visa-free Policy for Foreign Tourist Groups Entering the Country by Cruise Ship

Any foreign tourist group consisting of two or more individuals, which is organized and received by a travel agency registered in China, may enter China without a visa by a cruise ship via one of the cruise ports in the following 13 cities: Tianjin, Dalian (Liaoning Province), Shanghai, Lianyungang (Jiangsu Province), Wenzhou (Zhejiang Province), Zhoushan (Zhejiang Province), Xiamen (Fujian Province), Qingdao (Shandong Province), Guangzhou (Guangdong Province), Shenzhen (Guangdong Province), Beihai (Guangxi Zhuang Autonomous Region), Haikou (Hainan Province), and Sanya (Hainan Province). All eligible foreign tourist groups shall continue their journey to the following scheduled ports and depart China with the same cruise ship as scheduled. The tourists concerned may stay in Beijing and 11 coastal provinces, autonomous regions, and municipalities directly under the Central Government (namely Tianjin, Hebei, Liaoning, Shanghai, Jiangsu, Zhejiang, Fujian, Shandong, Guangdong, Guangxi, and Hainan) for a maximum of 15 days.

The stay duration specified in any of the aforementioned policies shall be calculated starting from 0:00 on the day following entry into China. For individuals who meet the requirements specified in the mutual visa exemption agreements with China or other visa-free policies initiated by the Chinese government, the respective regulations shall prevail.

Port Visa Policy

As of November 2024, China provides port visa (visa on arrival) services at 99 designated open ports across 73 cities. Foreign nationals holding ordinary passports may apply for a port visa entry if they urgently need to enter China for purposes including but not limited to business cooperation, exchanges, investment, entrepreneurship, family reunions, private affairs, or due to humanitarian reasons (e.g., attending funerals or visiting critically ill relatives) and have insufficient time to obtain a visa abroad. Additionally, foreign tourist groups organized and hosted by Chinese travel agencies are eligible for group port visas upon arrival.

Application Materials

- (1) Valid passports or other international travel documents;
- (2) Port Visa Application Form;
- (3) Photo;
- (4) Invitation letter, certification materials or travel agency invitation letter related to the reason for entry.

A port visa is valid for only one entry and the stay period shall not exceed 30 days.

Application Materials

Basic Documents

(1) Passport

Original passport valid for at least six months with blank visa pages, and one photocopy of the passport's photo/information page.

(2) Visa Application Form and Photo

One duly completed Visa Application Form of the People's Republic of China, with one recently taken, front-facing, color (light-colored background), bareheaded, passport-sized photo affixed to the designated area on the form.

(3) Supporting Documents of Legal Residence or Stay (applicable to visa applicants outside their home country)

If you are applying for a visa outside your country of nationality, you need to provide the original and photocopies of a valid document or visa that proves your legal stay, residence, work, or study in the country where you are applying.

(4) Original Chinese passport or original Chinese visa (applicable to those who once held Chinese nationality and later acquired foreign nationality)

If you are applying for a Chinese visa for the first time, you need to provide your original Chinese passport and photocopies of the passport photo/information page; if you have obtained a Chinese visa before and are applying for a visa with a newly renewed foreign passport, you need to provide your original foreign passport photo/information page and photocopies of the Chinese visa you have obtained (if the name recorded in the new passport is different from that in the original one, you need to also provide a document proving the name change issued by relevant officials).

The applicant shall apply for the visa before the starting date specified in the Short-Term Work Permit for Foreigners in China, and the duration of work shall not exceed the period indicated in the permit; (2) Work Permit for Foreign Experts in China or Notification Letter for Foreigner's Work Permit issued by the Foreign Experts Bureau; (3) Registration Certificate of Permanent Representative Office of Foreign (Regional) Enterprises issued by the industrial and commercial administration department; (4) Approval for commercial performances issued by the cultural administrative department (only applicable to applicants who come to China for commercial performances) and the Short-term Work Permit for Foreigners in China; the applicant shall also apply for a visa before the starting date indicated on the Short-term Work Permit for Foreigners in China, and the performance time cannot exceed the period indicated in the permit; (5) Invitation Letter for Foreigners to Engage in Offshore Oil Operations in the People's Republic of China issued by China National Offshore Oil Corporation.	The holder of the visa shall apply for a residence permit from the exit-entry administration authorities of public security organs of the local people's government at or above the county level in the intended place of residence within 30 days after entering China, unless the visa explicitly states "Entry may be allowed for 30 days upon arrival".



Tips

- (1) The invitation letter may be a fax, photocopy or printout, but the consular officer may require the applicant to provide the original invitation letter;
- (2) If necessary, the consular officer may require the applicant to provide other supporting documents or supplementary materials or request the applicant to attend an interview;
- (3) The consular officer decides whether to issue a visa and the visa's validity period, duration of stay and number of entries based on the applicant's specific circumstances;

Online Appointment and Inquiry

Foreign nationals in China who apply for visa extension, renewal and reissuance, or stay/residence permits can make online appointments and check the progress of their applications and document information through the National Immigration Administration's Government Service Platform. The platform also offers online assistance services by relatives or friends on behalf of the applicants to go through these procedures.

Entry

Foreigners who enter China shall submit their passports, other international travel documents, visas or other entry permits to the exit/entry border inspection authorities for examination, go through the prescribed formalities, and may enter upon examination and approval.

Prohibited Entry Situations

- (1) The applicant holds no valid exit/entry documents, or refuses or evades border inspection;
- (2) The applicant was deported, or was ordered to be repatriated, and the No-Entry-in-to-China period has not expired;
- (3) The applicant is suffering from serious mental disorders, infectious tuberculosis or other infectious diseases that may severely jeopardize public health;
- (4) The applicant may endanger China's national security or interests, disrupt social and public order, or engage in other illegal or criminal activities;
- (5) The applicant resorts to fraudulent acts in visa application or cannot guarantee expected expenditures during his or her stay in China;
- (6) The applicant may engage in activities not conforming to the types of visa after entering China;
- (7) Other circumstances in which entry is not allowed in accordance with laws or administrative regulations.

Important Notices

Fill out the Arrival Cards

When entering the country, foreign nationals need to prepare their valid entry and exit documents and fill out the Arrival Cards. The Arrival Cards can be obtained on your means of transportation or at the port of entry. Please complete the form and sign it before going through customs clearance. Foreign nationals entering the country with a Foreign Permanent Resident ID Card, group tourist visa or a tour group list (mutual visa exemption agreements) do not need to fill out an arrival card.

Fingerprint Retention

Fingerprints are collected for foreign nationals aged between 14 (inclusive) and 70 (inclusive) entering China. However, those who meet any of the following conditions are exempt from fingerprint collection:

- (1) Individuals holding diplomatic passports or Chinese diplomatic or courtesy visas, except for people of countries with reciprocal arrangements;
- (2) Individuals who are granted exemption from fingerprint collection under bilateral agreements or reciprocal arrangements;
- (3) Foreign officials at or above the vice-ministerial level and their delegation members who are granted centralized entry formalities processing convenience in accordance with the relevant regulations of the Ministry of Public Security;
- (4) Individuals whose ten fingerprints are incomplete or whose ten fingerprints cannot be retained;
- (5) Individuals who, under special circumstances, are exempted from having their fingerprints retained with the approval of the Ministry of Public Security.

Fast Customs Clearance Conditions

Some border ports have set up fast channels. If you meet the following conditions, you may register for fast customs clearance. After registration, you can use the fast channel to pass through customs efficiently.

- (1) Foreign nationals holding foreign passports and the Foreign Permanent Resident ID Card;
- (2) Foreign nationals holding foreign electronic passports and over-6-month Chinese residence permits;
- (3) Foreign crew members serving on scheduled international flights who are eligible for visa-free entry or have obtained C or Z visas, or a residence permit valid for one year (inclusive) or more.

Whether foreign nationals can use the fast channel clearance is subject to final inspection by the border inspection authorities.





Prohibited Items from Entry

- (1) Various weapons, simulated weapons, ammunition and explosives;
- (2) Counterfeit currency and counterfeit securities;
- (3) Printed materials, films, photographs, records, films, audio tapes, video tapes, laser discs, computer storage media and other items that are harmful to China's politics, economy, culture or morality;
- (4) Various strong poisons;
- (5) Opium, morphine, heroin, marijuana and other addictive narcotics and psychotropic substances;
- (6) Animals, plants and their products that carry dangerous germs, pests and other harmful organisms;
- (7) Food, medicine or other items that are harmful to human and animal health, come from epidemic areas or can spread other diseases.

Restricted Items from Entry

- (1) Radio transceivers and communication security equipment;
- (2) Cigarettes and alcohol;
- (3) Endangered and precious animals and plants (including specimens) and their seeds and propagation materials;
- (4) National currency;
- (5) Other articles restricted from entry into the country by customs.



Tips | Cigarettes, Alcohol, and Currency

You can bring in 400 cigarettes (2 cartons), 100 cigars, or 500 grams of pipe tobacco duty-free; and 2 bottles (1.5 liters) of liquor duty-free.

You can bring in no more than RMB 20,000 and cash no more than the equivalent of USD 5,000. If the amount exceeds the prescribed amount, you shall declare it to the customs.

Tips | Items Requiring Quarantine Examination and Approval

According to the List of Animals and Plants, Their Products and Other Quarantine Items Prohibited from Being Carried or Sent into the People's Republic of China, animals and animal products such as dried meat, fresh milk, butter, etc. (excluding milk powder), bird's nests (excluding canned bird's nests that have been commercially sterilized), plants, seeds and seedlings, fruits and vegetables, fungi, soil, etc. are all prohibited items from being carried or sent into China. They shall go through quarantine examination and approval procedures before entry, and they can only enter the country after passing quarantine inspection.

Tips | Endangered Species and Their Products

China implements protection for endangered species and their products. Travelers should be careful to distinguish when buying handicrafts or souvenirs abroad. For protected species listed in the Appendix of the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES), such as ivory, giant clams, and agarwood, any trade method or carrying or mailing of endangered species and their products into or out of the country is illegal, except for those who legally hold import and export permits and go through customs formalities in accordance with regulations.

Health Inspection and Quarantine

(1) Foreign nationals intending to settle or reside in China for one year or more (including those studying in China for one academic year) are required to undergo a health check at the International Travel Healthcare Center (hereinafter referred to as the Healthcare Center) under the China Entry-Exit Inspection and Quarantine Bureau within one month after they enter China. They shall obtain a health certificate before they can apply for residence and employment;

(2) Foreign nationals who have not obtained a residence permit in China or are studying in China on a student visa, or those who have obtained a valid residence permit but engage in employment with entities other than their employer, are required to present a health certificate issued by the China Entry-Exit Inspection and Quarantine Bureau before they can go through the employment application procedures at the competent labor employment management authorities;

(3) Foreign nationals may submit their original health examination records from local public hospitals or notarized records from private hospitals. For authentication, such records must be verified by China's embassies or consulates abroad. The certification is valid for six months from the date of issuance. Foreign nationals who submit health examination records should bring the original records (which shall include the original examination results, the signature of the chief physician, and the hospital seal), their passport, and one photocopy of their passport to the designated health centers for verification. If the records meet the requirements, the verification procedures will be completed within 3-4 working days, and a Certificate of Verification for Physical Examination Record for Foreigners or Overseas Chinese will be issued. This certificate is valid for six months from the date of issuance.

Bringing Pets into China

The only live animals that can be brought into the country are dogs or cats (hereinafter referred to as "pets"). Each person is limited to bringing one pet at a time.

Any person carrying a pet into the People's Republic of China shall submit to the customs authorities a valid quarantine certificate and a vaccination certificate issued by the official animal quarantine authorities of the exporting country or region. Pets shall be equipped with a microchip or other valid identification documents.

Incoming pets shall be quarantined for 30 days (including the detention period).

Pets from countries or regions where rabies occurs shall be quarantined for 30 days in a quarantine facility designated by the customs. Pets from countries or regions where rabies does not occur shall be quarantined in a quarantine facility designated by the customs for 7 days and isolated at other places designated by customs for the rest 23 days.

Any person entering China with working dogs (such as guide dogs, search and rescue dogs, etc.) shall be exempted from quarantine if the owner provides official training certification.

Customs supervises and inspects the pets under quarantine.

Any person bringing a pet into the People's Republic of China who fails to provide the customs authorities with a quarantine certificate and a vaccination certificate issued by the official animal quarantine authorities of the exporting country/region, or if the number of pets exceeds the limit, the customs will either return the pets within a specified period or euthanize them.

For working dogs that cannot provide vaccination certificates, the customs can vaccinate them against rabies upon application by the owner.

If the pet is subject to mandatory return by customs authorities, the owner must retrieve the pet and exit China within the prescribed time limit with the detention voucher issued by the customs; any pet not retrieved by the owner within the specified period shall be deemed automatically abandoned.

Exit

Foreign nationals who exit China shall submit their exit/entry documents including passports or other international travel documents to the exit/entry border inspection authorities for examination, and verify the validity period of their visa.

Prohibited Exit Situations

- (1) Any individual who has been sentenced to criminal penalties but has not yet completed their sentences, or is a defendant in criminal cases or a criminal suspect, except those convicted who are to be transferred to other countries to serve their sentences under relevant agreements;
- (2) Any individual who is involved in unsettled civil cases and is not allowed to exit China upon the decision of the People's Courts of China;
- (3) Any individual who fails to pay labor remuneration owed to workers and therefore is ordered not to leave the country by decisions of the relevant departments under the State Council or of provincial, autonomous regional, or municipal people's governments;
- (4) Other circumstances in which exit shall not be allowed in accordance with laws or administrative regulations.

Prohibited Items from Exit

- (1) All items listed as prohibited for entry;
- (2) Manuscripts, printed materials, films, photographs, records, movies, audio tapes, video tapes, laser discs, computer storage media and other items containing state secrets;
- (3) Precious cultural relics and other cultural relics prohibited from export;
- (4) Endangered and precious animals and plants (including specimens), as well as their seeds and propagation materials.

Restricted Items from Exit

- (1) Precious metals such as gold and silver and their products;
- (2) National currency;
- (3) Foreign currencies and foreign securities;
- (4) Radio transceivers and communication security equipment;
- (5) Precious Chinese medicinal herbs;
- (6) General cultural relics;
- (7) Other articles restricted from export by customs.

Tips | About Foreign Currency

You may carry foreign currency up to the equivalent of USD 5,000 when leaving China. If you carry more than USD 5,000, you need to apply for a permit and declare it to customs.

Regulations on the Exit of Specific Items

(1) Cultural relics (including works of deceased modern famous calligraphers and painters) carried, checked or mailed by individuals for export shall be declared to the Customs. The customs will inspect and release them based on the identification mark stamped by the cultural administrative department and the cultural relics export invoice, or the export permit issued by the cultural administrative department designated by the Ministry of Culture. Printed materials and audio-visual products carried, checked or mailed by individuals entering or leaving the country shall be declared to the Customs. If the amount exceeds the reasonable amount for personal use, it shall be returned;

(2) The entry of cultural relics. Individuals who carry or mail cultural relics into the country shall declare them to the Customs voluntarily and truthfully upon entry. The Customs shall allow entry of them within a reasonable amount for personal use. Special note: The entry procedures for donated cultural relics shall be handled in accordance with the relevant regulations on the import of goods;

(3) Re-entry of Temporarily Imported Cultural Relics.

- Individuals who carry, check or mail cultural relics into China for temporary entry shall submit a written declaration to the Customs upon entry, specifying the necessity for re-exit of such relics. The Customs at the port of entry shall seal the cultural relics and entrust the declarer to deliver them to the National Cultural Relics Entry and Exit Examination and Management Office designated by the National Cultural Heritage Administration (NCHA).

- Cultural relics that are not declared upon entry, whose customs seals are damaged, or whose re-exit appraisal procedures have not been completed after entry shall go through the exit procedures in accordance with the regulations on the exit of cultural relics.



Tax Refund at Departure

Tax Refund Conditions

If you have lived in China for no more than 183 consecutive days, and your date of departure is within 90 days from the date of purchase of the tax-free items, and the total amount of VAT-free items purchased in a single tax refund shop on a single day reaches RMB 500, you can enjoy the departure tax refund benefit.

Tax Refund Rate

The general VAT refund rate for taxable items is 11%, but you may also need to pay a certain service charge.

VAT refunds for departing passengers are handled by the tax refund agency located in the restricted area of departure ports where the outbound formalities for foreign passengers are handled. Foreign passengers must submit their valid identity documents, the Departure Tax Refund Application Form verified and stamped by the Customs, and the sales invoice of the refundable items to apply for a refund. The VAT refund rate for items subject to the 13% VAT rate is 11%, and for items subject to the 9% VAT rate is 8%.

$\text{VAT refundable} = \text{sales invoice amount (including VAT)} \times \text{VAT refund rate}$

$\text{Service charge} = \text{sales invoice amount (including VAT)} \times \text{service charge rate (2\%)}$

$\text{Net VAT refund amount} = \text{the amount of VAT refundable} - \text{service charge by tax refund agencies}$

Tax Refund Process

When leaving the country, you may apply for tax refunds at the Customs with the Departure Tax Refund Application Form provided by the tax refund store, sales invoices for the refundable items, tax-refundable items, passport and other valid identification documents. After verification and stamping by the Customs, the tax refund agency located in the restricted area of the departure port will handle the tax refund procedures.

Refund Currency and Receipt Method

The refund currency is RMB. For refund amounts not exceeding RMB 10,000, you can choose a cash refund or bank transfer. For amounts exceeding RMB 10,000, the refund will be processed through bank transfer.



“Refund-upon-Purchase” Service for Departure Tax Refund

Under China's "Refund-upon-Purchase" service for departure tax refunds, when foreign tourists purchase tax-refundable goods at designated stores in regions implementing the departure tax refund policy, they can immediately claim a cash advance equivalent to the tax refund amount (hereinafter referred to as "advance payment") at the store after signing an agreement and completing credit card pre-authorization procedures.

Foreign tourists wishing to utilize this service must meet the following requirements: They must pass customs verification upon departure, exit through designated ports within the agreed time frame as stipulated in the agreement, and comply with all policy regulations governing departure tax refunds.

Procedures for "Refund-upon-Purchase" Service:

(1) Store Issuance & Advance Payment. At designated "Refund-upon-Purchase" stores, when foreign tourists purchase tax-refundable goods and opt for this service: The store or tax refund agency must present an agreement for the tourist to sign. A credit card pre-authorization is processed. The store issues a Tax Refund Application Form for Overseas Tourists and provides an on-site advance payment (equal to the refund amount in RMB);

(2) Customer Verification. Upon departure, the tourist must: present the purchased goods, Tax Refund Application Form for Overseas Tourists, sales invoice, and valid ID and declare and undergo customs verification at the port of exit;

(3) Tax Refund Agency Review. At the departure port's restricted area, the tourist must submit the following to the tax refund agency within the quarantine area of the departure port: the valid passport ID, the customer-stamped Tax Refund Application Form for Overseas Tourists, and sales invoices. The tax refund agency shall review the relevant material information and handle the following different scenarios accordingly.

- For tourists who depart through designated ports within the agreed time frame as stipulated in the agreement and comply with all departure tax refund policy requirements, the tax refund agency shall release the credit card pre-authorization and finalize the tax refund procedure, with the advance payment being recognized as the official tax refund. For cases that fail to meet the departure tax refund requirements, the tax refund agency shall recover the advance payment through the credit card pre-authorization charge and will not process any tax refund for this transaction.
- For passengers who fail to comply with the agreement terms - either exceeding the promised departure period or not departing from designated ports - the tax refund agency shall recover the advance payment through credit card pre-authorization deduction within three business days after the promised departure date expires. When the passenger departs subsequently, the tax refund agency at the departure location shall then review and process the tax refund according to the departure tax refund policy regulations.

STAY AND RESIDENCE



Stay and Residence

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Accommodation Registration Requirements

(1) For foreigners staying in a hotel, the hotel shall register his/her accommodation. For foreigners residing somewhere other than a hotel, they or their host shall register the accommodation with the local public security organs within 24 hours after check-in at their place of residence;

(2) When a foreigner exchanges a new entry-exit document, applies for a new visa or a residence permit, or changes his/her residential address, he/she shall promptly update his/her accommodation registration at the public security organ in their place of residence.

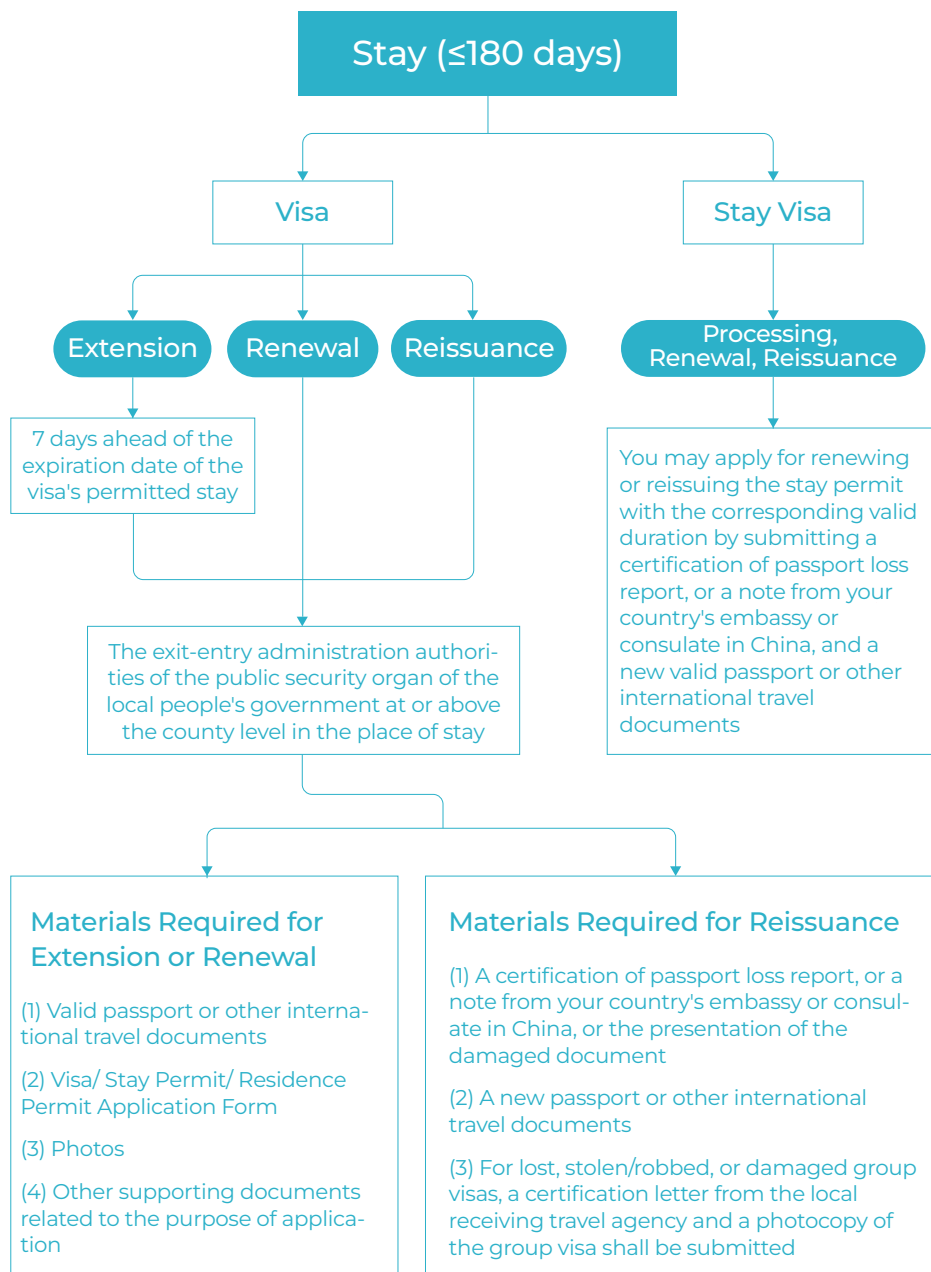
Required Documents

(1) Foreign nationals shall provide the original of their passport or other valid identification documents such as their Foreign Permanent Resident ID Card;

(2) When an individual or organization that hosts foreign nationals applies for temporary accommodation registration on their behalf, they shall also present the agent's valid identity documents or a company certification of the host;

(3) If the residential address is a self-owned property, the Real Estate Ownership Certificate shall be submitted; if the residential address is a rented house, the house rental contract shall be submitted; if they lodge in others' residence, the identity documents of the homeowner or the actual tenant of the house and relevant property documents shall be submitted.

Visa and Stay Permit Issuance Process



Visa Extension

Foreigners who apply for an extension of their visa stay period shall submit an application to the exit-entry administration authorities of the public security organ within seven days before the expiration date of the stay duration indicated in the visa, and submit relevant application documents as required. The cumulative extension period shall not exceed the original stay duration indicated in the visa.

Visa Renewal

(I) Foreigners who need to change their reason for stay and be granted entry facilitation, or need to apply for a renewal of an ordinary visa due to objective reasons for splitting from a group tour after entering with a group visa or obtaining a renewed passport, shall submit the following supporting documents:

Apply for the renewal of F visa	A certification letter issued by the inviting entity shall be submitted. It can be renewed with a zero-entry or single-entry visa with a validity period of no more than three months and a stay period of no more than 180 days.
Apply for the renewal of X2 visa	A letter and admission or enrollment certificate issued by an educational or training institution in China shall be submitted.	It can be renewed with a zero-entry, single-entry or double-entry visa with a validity period of no more than one year and a stay period of no more than 180 days.



(2) For foreigners who apply for renewal of their passport due to its expiration or the running out of visa pages, they shall submit the passport held at the time of the current entry or relevant certification issued by the embassy or consulate of their country in China indicating that the passport they held at the current entry has been retrieved. In return, a visa with the same type, entry validity period, duration of stay and remaining valid number of entries as the original visa may be renewed.

(3) Foreigners who add accompanying persons after entry shall submit the passport used for this entry and the birth certificates of the accompanying persons. The visa may be renewed in accordance with the preceding provisions of this article.

(4) Foreigners who enter the country with a group visa and apply for a group stay shall submit a letter of certification from the receiving travel agency and other materials. The visa may be renewed in accordance with the preceding provisions of this article.

The cumulative stay period indicated in the renewed visa shall not exceed one year, calculated continuously from the date of the current entry.





Visa Reissuance

Foreigners who apply for a visa reissuance due to the loss, damage, or theft/robbery of their current visa after entering China shall submit the following supporting documents:

- (1) If your visa is lost or stolen/robbed, you shall submit a certification of passport loss report or a note from your country's embassy or consulate in China, as well as a new valid passport or other international travel documents;
- (2) If your visa is damaged, you shall present the damaged passport or a note from your country's embassy or consulate in China, as well as a new valid passport or other international travel documents;
- (3) If your group visa is lost, stolen/robbed or damaged, a letter of certification from the local travel agency and a photocopy of the group visa shall be submitted.

A visa can be reissued with the same type, entry validity period, stay duration and remaining valid entry counts as per the original visa.

Application Requirements

Where visa-exempt foreigners need to stay in China longer than the visa-free period, or foreign seamen and their accompanying family members need to leave the cities where the ports are located, or under other circumstances in which foreigners' stay permits should be applied for, they shall apply for such permits in accordance with relevant regulations.

Application Materials and Requirements

(1) Foreigners who enter China without a visa and need to stay beyond the visa exemption period for non-diplomatic or official reasons shall submit supporting documents in accordance with relevant regulations and a stay permit for the corresponding period may be issued;

(2) If foreign seamen and their accompanying family members need to leave the port city where the ship is docked, they shall submit a seamen's passport or other international travel documents and a letter of guarantee from the shipping agency, as well as confirmed train/ship tickets with specific departure dates and seat reservations or other supporting documents related to the reason for their stay, and a stay permit with a stay period not exceeding 30 days may be issued;

(3) Individuals who have renounced Chinese nationality with approval and need to stay in China shall submit a certificate of renunciation of Chinese nationality, a foreign passport or other international travel documents and relevant supporting documents for stay. A stay permit with a stay period not exceeding 180 days may be issued;

(4) Foreigners whose residence permit is terminated and need to continue to stay for humanitarian reasons shall submit their residence permit and relevant supporting documents. A stay permit with a stay period not exceeding 30 days may be issued;

(5) Foreign infants born in China who need to stay in China shall submit the infant's birth certificate, passport and the passports of both parents. A stay permit corresponding to the stay period of his/her parents may be issued.

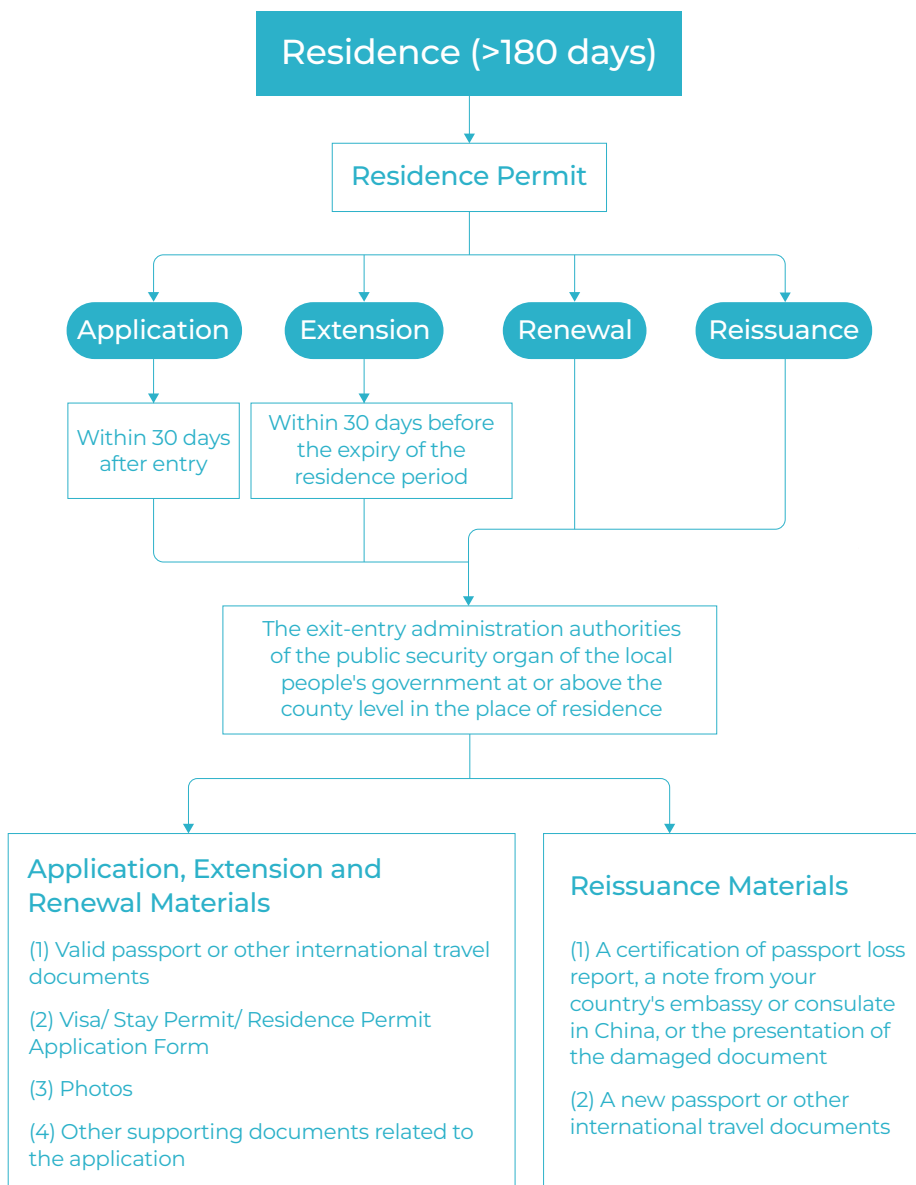
Renewal and Reissuance

Foreigners holding stay permits who are unable to leave the country within the validity period of their stay permits due to objective reasons may apply for a renewal of their stay permits. The application materials and renewal requirements shall be handled in accordance with the above-mentioned provisions.

Foreigners whose stay permits are lost, damaged or stolen/robbed shall submit a certification of passport loss report or a note from the embassy or consulate of their country in China and a new valid passport or other international travel documents, and a stay permit for the corresponding period can be reissued.



Residence Permit Issuance Process



Application Requirements

After entering the country, foreigners who need to reside in China for reasons other than diplomatic or official matters may apply to the exit-entry administration authorities of the public security organ for the issuance, extension, renewal or reissuance of residence permits in accordance with relevant regulations.

Foreigners who meet state criteria as specialized talents or investors, or who need to change their stay to residence for humanitarian reasons, may apply for a foreigner's residence permit with the approval of the exit-entry administration authorities of the public security organ of municipal-level or higher local people's governments.

Foreigners applying for residence permits, as well as the extension, renewal or reissuance of the permits, shall go to the exit-entry administration authorities of the public security organ to go through the relevant procedures in person. Foreigners who are high-level talents needed by the state, urgently needed specialized talents, those who are under 16 years of age or over 60 years of age, or those who are unable to move due to illness or other reasons, may apply through the inviting entity or individual, the applicant's relatives, or relevant specialized service agencies.



Required Documents

- (1) A valid passport or other international travel documents;
- (2) Fill out the Visa/ Stay Permit/ Residence Permit Application Form and submit one photo that complies with the standards of the Guidelines for Taking Photos for Entry and Exit Documents;
- (3) Documents supporting the reason for application (for details, please refer to the table below);
- (4) Other procedures that shall be performed and supporting documents that shall be submitted. The originals of the relevant documents may be submitted for examination and the photocopies retained.



Tips | Time Requirements

If the visa (Z, S1 and Q1) held by a foreigner indicates that he/she needs to apply for a residence permit after entering China, he/she shall apply within 30 days to the exit-entry administration authorities of the public security organ in the proposed place of residence for a foreigner's residence permit.

Tips | Health Certificate

Foreigners applying for a residence permit with a validity period of more than one year shall, in accordance with relevant regulations, submit a physical health certificate issued by the local health quarantine department or health and medical department at or above the county level to prove that the applicant does not suffer from severe mental disorders, infectious tuberculosis or other infectious diseases that may cause serious harm to public health.

Extension, Renewal and Reissuance

Extension	Foreigners who apply for an extension of their residence permit shall submit an application to the entry-exit administration authorities of the public security organ 30 days before the expiration of the residence permit and provide supporting documents related to the application. Upon review, if the reasons for the extension are justifiable and sufficient, the extension of the residence period shall be granted; if the extension of the residence period is not granted, he/she shall leave the country on schedule.
Renewal	If there is any change in the registration items of a foreigner's residence permit (name, reason for residence, passport or other international travel document number, etc.), he/she shall apply to the exit-entry administration authorities of the public security organ for the change within 10 days from the date of the change in the registration items, and submit supporting documents related to the change in personal basic information and reason for residence in accordance with the provisions above, and the residence permit may be renewed.

Foreigners aged 16 or above who stay or reside in China shall carry with them their passports or other international travel documents, or foreigner stay/residence permits, for inspection by public security authorities.

Passport Loss

Foreign nationals who have lost their passports should immediately report the loss, apply for a passport reissuance at their embassy/consulate, and reapply for a corresponding visa or residence permit at the entry-exit administration authorities. The specific steps are as follows:

- (1) Report the loss to the local public security bureau and obtain a certification letter;
- (2) Apply for a new passport at their embassy or consulate in China;
- (3) Go to the local public security bureau to update the accommodation registration information once the reissued passport is received;
- (4) Apply for a reissued visa or residence permit at the exit-entry administration authorities of the public security bureau in the residential place within 10 days.

Passport Renewal

Foreign nationals with a passport about to expire shall consult their embassy or consulate in advance regarding the time frame required for passport extension or renewal. They must ensure that the passport is extended or a new passport is obtained before their visa or residence permit expires. The following requirements must be observed:

- (1) After obtaining the new passport, they shall bring both the old and new ones to the local public security bureau to re-register for accommodation within 24 hours;
- (2) Within 10 days of obtaining a passport, they shall go to the exit-entry administration authorities of the public security organ in the residential place to handle visa or residence permit renewal and other related matters;
- (3) After obtaining a new visa or residence permit, they shall go to the local public security bureau to update the accommodation registration information within 24 hours.



Tips

Foreigners in China who do not hold valid passports or other international travel documents due to reasons such as loss, damage, theft/robbery, or expiration, and who are unable to obtain a reissuance at their embassy or consulate in China may submit a certification of passport loss report or a note from the embassy or consulate of their country in China, or the damaged or expired document along with a temporary identity certificate used as a substitute. A foreigner's entry-exit permit with a validity period of no more than 30 days shall be issued by the exit-entry administration authorities of public security organs at or above the prefectural level (including districts/counties under direct municipal jurisdictions).

Accepting Institutions

The public security organs of the people's governments of cities with districts, and the public security sub-bureaus and county bureaus in municipalities directly under the central government.



Application Requirements

Foreigners who have made remarkable contributions to the economic and social development of China or who meet other conditions for permanent residence in China may apply for permanent residence in China.

Foreigners applying for permanent residence in China shall abide by Chinese laws and regulations, be in good health, have no criminal record, and meet one of the following conditions:

- (1) The applicant has made direct and stable investments in China, with good tax payment records for three consecutive years;
- (2) The applicant holds the position of deputy general manager, factory deputy director or above, or those with professional associate senior titles or above, such as associate professor or associate researcher; or has been enjoying the equivalent salary in China for at least four consecutive years, and residing in China for a total of not less than three years within four years with good tax records;
- (3) The applicant has made significant and outstanding contribution(s) to China and is especially needed in the country;
- (4) The spouse and the unmarried children (under age 18) of the applicant who meet the foregoing conditions specified in (1), (2) or (3);

(5) The applicant is the spouse of a Chinese citizen or of a foreign national who has obtained permanent residence in China; The applicant and his or her spouse have been married for a minimum of five years; The applicant has had a minimum of five consecutive years of residence in China with no less than nine months each year, and has a stable source of income and domicile;

(6) The applicant under the age of 18 is unmarried and dependent on his or her parents;

(7) The applicant is or above the age of 60, has no direct relatives abroad, and lives with his or her direct relative in China; the applicant has stayed in China for at least five consecutive years with at least nine months of residence each year, and has a stable source of income and domicile.



Case Not Accepted

For foreign nationals who do not meet the foregoing conditions, his/her application for permanent residence in China shall not be accepted.

Additionally, according to Article 24 of the Measures for the Administration of Examination and Approval of Foreigners' Permanent Residence in China, where any of the following circumstances occurs, the National Immigration Administration (NIA) has the right to cancel the previously obtained permanent residence in China of foreign nationals and confiscate their Foreign Permanent Resident ID Cards or declare their Foreign Permanent Resident ID Cards invalid.

(1) Foreigners nationals who may endanger China's national security or interests;

(2) Foreigners who have been sentenced to be deported by a people's court;

(3) Foreigners who obtained permanent residence in China by false materials or other unlawful means;

(4) Foreigners whose residence in China, without approval, is less than three months each year or less than one year cumulatively within five years.

Application Materials

In addition to a valid foreign passport, a Health Certificate, and a foreign Certificate of No Criminal Record, the applicants shall submit the following materials when applying for permanent residence in China. The certificate of no criminal record issued within China shall be officially verified by the exit-entry administration authorities.

Employees	(1) A photocopy of the employment certificate; (2) A photocopy of the Foreigner's Work Permit in China; (3) A photocopy of the registration certificate of the employer; (4) A certificate of disclosure of the company's annual report; (5) Photocopies of the foreign-invested enterprise approval certificate and annual inspection certificate; (6) Those who work in key universities need to provide proof that the university they work for is a 211 Project one or a first-batch undergraduate admission one; (7) A photocopy of the project certification document or confirmation letter; (8) A photocopy of the individual tax payment certificate.
Special personnel	(1) A photocopy of the recommendation letter; (2) Photocopies of relevant awards and achievement certificates.

Type of People	Required Documents
The spouse and unmarried children (under age 18) of the above-mentioned eligible investors, employees and special personnel	(1) Photocopies of marriage certificates, birth certificates or parent-child relationship certificates; (2) Photocopies of the Foreign Permanent Resident ID Card of the above-mentioned investors, employees, and special personnel.
Spouse	(1) A photocopy of the marriage certificate; (2) A photocopy of the identity certificate of the spouse; (3) A photocopy of the housing rental certificate or property ownership certificate; (4) A photocopy of a certificate proving that the applicant has a stable source of income.
Children	(1) A photocopy of the birth certificate or relationship certificate; (2) Photocopies of identity certificates of parents who are of Chinese nationality, or photocopies of valid passports and Foreign Permanent Resident ID Cards of parents who are of foreign nationality; (3) If the parents are divorced, a photocopy of a certificate that proves the sponsor has the responsibilities of guardianship of the child shall be submitted.
Relatives	(1) A photocopy of the certificate proving that the applicant has no direct relatives abroad; (2) A photocopy of a certificate that proves the domestic kinship; (3) Photocopies of the Chinese sponsor's household registration document and Resident Identity Card, or photocopies of the foreign sponsor's valid passport and Foreign Permanent Resident ID Card; (4) A photocopy of the housing rental certificate or property ownership certificate; (5) A photocopy of a certificate proving that the applicant has a stable source of income.

Permanent Residence Application Convenience

(1) High-level foreign talents, foreign nationals who have made significant contributions or who are urgently needed by China, may apply to the exit-entry administration department of the public security agency for permanent residence in China, based on recommendations by relevant national authorities, provincial people's governments, or national key development area management departments. Their foreign spouses and minor children may also apply together;

(2) Foreigners who have worked in China for four consecutive years, resided in China for at least six months each year, have an annual salary that is at least six times the average of urban employees in the region for the previous year and have paid at least 20% of the annual salary in individual income tax may apply to the exit-entry administration department of the public security agency for permanent residence in China. Their foreign spouses and minor children may also apply together;

(3) Overseas Chinese working in China who hold a doctoral degree or have worked in a national key development area for four consecutive years and have resided in China for at least six months each year may apply to the exit-entry administration department of the public security agency for permanent residence in China. Their foreign spouses and minor children may also apply together.



Application for Chinese Nationality

Application Requirements	A foreign national or stateless person who is willing to abide by the Chinese Constitution and laws and meets one of the following conditions may be naturalized as a Chinese national upon approval of their applications: (1) The applicant is a near relative of a Chinese national; (2) The applicant has settled in China; (3) The applicant has other legitimate reasons.
Accepting Institutions	The application for naturalization as a Chinese national at home shall be handled by the public security bureaus of the cities or counties where the applicants reside; The applications abroad shall be handled by China's diplomatic representative agencies and consular offices.
Approval Authority	The application for naturalization as a Chinese national is subject to review and approval by the National Immigration Administration of the People's Republic of China.
Application Materials	(1) Fill in the Application Form for Naturalization as a National of the People's Republic of China; (2) Submit a written declaration on voluntarily applying for naturalization as a Chinese national and renunciation of foreign nationality; (3) Submit corresponding supporting materials.
Other matters	Applicants shall not retain their foreign nationality upon approval of their application for naturalization as a Chinese national. Those having acquired Chinese nationality shall go through exit-entry procedures in accordance with the regulations for Chinese citizens.

Application for Restoration of Chinese Nationality

Application Requirements	Foreign nationals who have previously held Chinese nationality may apply to restore their Chinese nationality for legitimate reasons. Those whose applications for the restoration of Chinese nationality are approved shall no longer retain foreign nationality.
Accepting Institutions	The application for naturalization as a Chinese national at home shall be handled by the public security bureaus of the cities or counties where the applicants reside; The applications abroad shall be handled by China's diplomatic representative agencies and consular offices.
Approval Authority	The applications for the restoration of Chinese nationality are subject to review and approval by the National Immigration Administration of the People's Republic of China.
Application Materials	(1) Fill in the Application Form for Restoration of Nationality of the People's Republic of China; (2) Submit a written declaration on voluntarily applying for the restoration of Chinese nationality and renunciation of foreign nationality; (3) Submit corresponding supporting materials.
Other Matters	Applicants shall not retain their foreign nationality upon approval of their application for restoration of Chinese nationality. Those having their Chinese nationality restored shall go through exit and entry procedures in accordance with the regulations for Chinese citizens.

Bank Card

You can open a bank account in RMB or foreign currency at the nearest bank branch with your passport or other valid documents. Commercial banks such as the Industrial and Commercial Bank of China, Agricultural Bank of China, Bank of China, China Construction Bank, and Bank of Communications all provide account opening services. For specific application conditions, you can consult the branch or check the bank's official website. Once you have opened a bank account, you can access services like depositing and withdrawing RMB and foreign currencies, foreign exchange transactions, domestic and international transfers, and foreign currency exchange and payment.

Cash

At the airport or port of entry, you can withdraw cash from ATMs that accept international cards or choose to convert foreign currency into RMB through currency exchange agencies or self-service exchange machines. These options are also available in urban areas.



Foreign exchange agencies, some hotel front desks, bank branches, and self-service exchange machines all offer foreign currency to RMB cash exchange services. These places typically display prominent "Exchange" signs.



Tip: You can still exchange your remaining RMB cash into foreign currency at a suitable exchange agency before leaving the country.

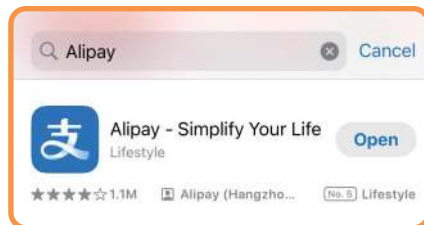

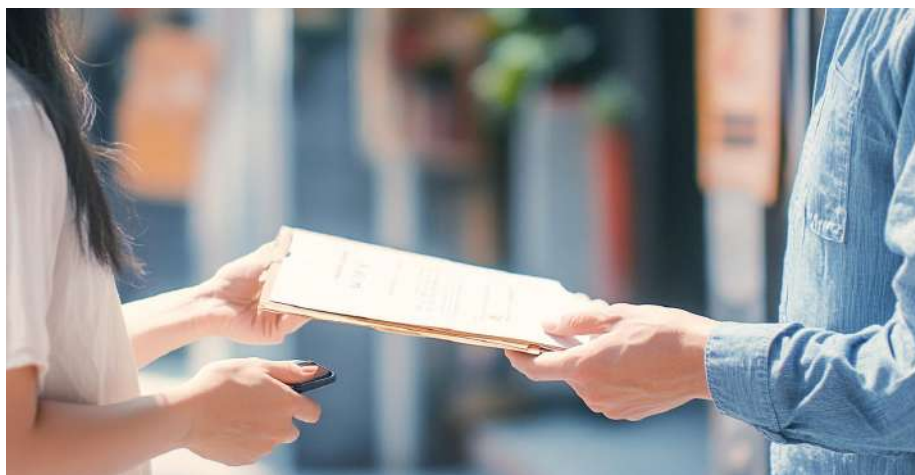
Rent a House

Where to rent a house?

You can choose a regular rental agency to help you find a suitable house. In China, many rental agencies have their own online platforms and mobile apps. You can enter the rental module and search for houses on the website in advance based on location, rent, apartment type, house condition and other conditions. Of course, you can also go directly to the rental agency's store and discuss with a rental agent in person. Usually, the rental agent will accompany you to check the available houses.

If you are satisfied with the house and have confirmed your intention to rent it, you need to: sign a rental contract with the landlord, agreeing on the terms of the rental period, rental purpose, rental price, repair responsibilities, and other rights and obligations; pay relevant fees, including deposits and rent; then register with the property management department. To avoid potential disputes, it's recommended to sign a bilingual rental contract with one language as the primary reference. Also, consider working with a reputable rental agency to find a suitable house.



Buy a House

China allows qualified foreign individuals to purchase commercial housing for their own use and residence. Commercial housing transactions must comply with relevant Chinese laws and regulations. Commercial housing sales can be priced by unit, by net floor area or by floor area. Among them, the floor area of commercial housing is composed of the net floor area and the shared floor area. The former pertains to independent ownership, while the latter falls under joint ownership. For more information, please refer to the Regulatory Measures on the Sale of Commercial Houses issued by the Ministry of Housing and Urban-Rural Development.



Which overseas institutions and individuals can buy houses in China?

Branches and representative offices established by foreign institutions in China (except for enterprises approved to engage in real estate business) and foreign individuals who have worked or studied in China for more than one year are eligible to purchase commercial housing only for their own use or residence in accordance with their actual needs. Foreign institutions that have not established branches or representative offices in China and foreign individuals who have worked or studied in China for less than one year are not allowed to purchase commercial housing.

For cities with housing purchase restrictions, overseas individuals purchasing houses shall comply with local policy regulations.

Foreign institutions that establish branches or representative offices in China are only eligible to purchase non-residential properties required for office use in the city of registration, unless otherwise provided by laws and regulations.

How do overseas institutions and individuals register property rights when purchasing a house in China?

Foreign institutions and individuals who meet the requirements shall use the real-name system to purchase commercial housing for their self-use or residence and go to the land and real estate authorities to handle the corresponding procedures of land use rights and housing property registration with valid certificates (foreign institutions shall hold certificates of approval from China's relevant authorities for the establishment of their domestic institutions, and foreign individuals shall hold certificates approved by the relevant authorities for their work and study in China, the same below). Real estate property registration departments shall handle property registration for foreign institutions and individuals in accordance with the principle of self-use and self-residence strictly, and shall not register those who do not meet the requirements.

When applying for the filing of commodity housing pre-sale contracts and the registration of the house ownership, foreign individuals shall provide: a certificate issued by the relevant department proving that the foreign individual (excluding residents from Hong Kong, Macao, and Taiwan as well as overseas Chinese) has worked in China for more than one year, and a written commitment that the foreign individual has no other housing in China.



What are the procedures for branches and representative offices established by overseas institutions in China to purchase houses in China?

(1) If the money is remitted from abroad, the applicant shall apply to the designated foreign exchange bank with the following documents. After the designated foreign exchange bank verifies the authenticity of the application, it shall convert the foreign exchange funds into RMB and directly transfer them to the RMB account of the real estate developer:

- Commercial housing sales contract or pre-sale contract;
- Approval documents and valid registration certificates for the establishment of domestic branches and representative offices;
- Relevant certificates issued by the real estate administration department, including registration and filing of the pre-sale contract for commercial housing purchased by the domestic branch or representative office at the place of registration;
- A written commitment that the commercial housing purchased is for self-use.

The foreign exchange accounts under the current account of real estate development enterprises shall not hold funds remitted from abroad by their domestic branches and representative offices for purchases of commercial housing.

(2) If the purchase price of a house is paid with funds from a domestic foreign exchange account, the applicant shall apply to the designated foreign exchange bank with the documents specified in paragraph (1) of this Article. After the designated foreign exchange bank verifies the authenticity of the application, it shall directly transfer the foreign exchange settlement funds for the purchase of the house to the RMB account of the real estate development enterprise. The funds in the current account of a domestic representative office shall not be used to purchase domestic commercial housing through the conversion of foreign exchange.

What are the procedures for foreign individuals who have worked or studied in the country for more than one year to purchase a house in China?

(1) If the money is remitted from abroad, the applicant shall apply to the designated foreign exchange bank with the following documents. After the designated foreign exchange bank verifies the authenticity of the application, it shall convert the foreign exchange funds into RMB and transfer them to the real estate development company's RMB account:

- Commercial housing sales contract or pre-sale contract;
- Valid passport or other identification documents;
- A valid domestic employment contract or student status certificate with a duration of more than one year;
- Relevant certificates issued by the real estate regulatory department, such as the registration and filing of the pre-sale contract for the commercial housing purchased by the overseas individual in the city where he/she is located;
- The foreign exchange accounts under the current account of real estate development enterprises shall not hold funds remitted from abroad by overseas individuals for house purchases.

(2) Where the purchase of a house is paid from a domestic foreign exchange account, the applicant shall apply to the designated foreign exchange bank with the various documents specified in paragraph (1) of this Article. After verifying the application's authenticity, the designated foreign exchange bank shall directly transfer the funds for housing purchase to the RMB account of the real estate development enterprise.

Foreign institutions and individuals applying for foreign exchange settlement for house purchases should strictly follow the Notice on Issues Concerning Foreign Exchange Management in the Real Estate Sector.

Tips | How long is the land use period?

In China, land use rights have a certain term, ranging from 40 to 70 years. Specifically, land for commercial, tourism and entertainment use has a term of 40 years, while residential land has a term of 70 years. Article 359 of the Civil Code of the People's Republic of China, which came into effect on January 1, 2020, clearly stipulates that "the term of the right to use land for the construction of housing units shall be automatically renewed upon expiration."

Sell a House

Foreign nationals can sell their houses in China. You need to go through relevant notarization procedures and clarify the details of the entrustment contract, and it is best to open a bank account in China to receive the house payment. The specific procedures are as follows:

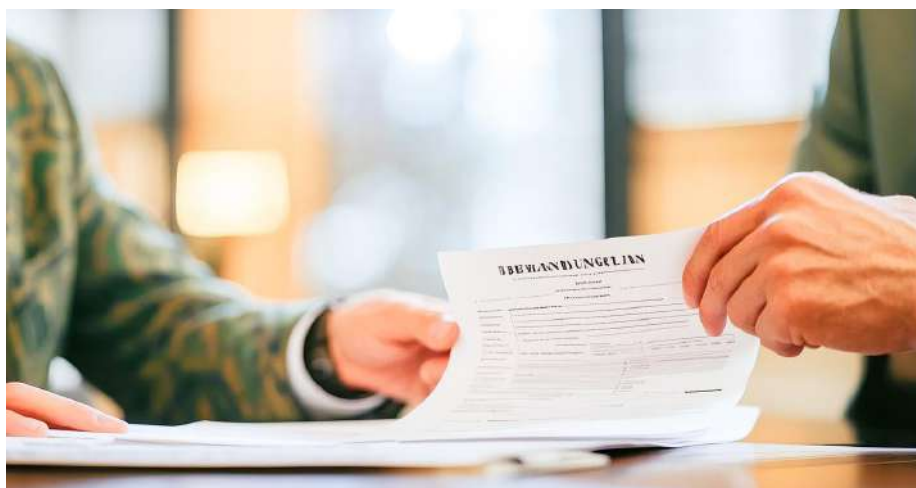


(1) Handle power of attorney, notarial certificates and certification.

In reality, many foreign nationals will entrust professional real estate lawyers to handle the sale of their houses. In this case, when it is not the householder who sells the house himself, the householder must first issue a power of attorney authorizing the one entrusted to sell the house, and the power of attorney must be notarized.

The notarization procedures of the power of attorney depend on the specific circumstances. On March 8, 2023, China officially joined the Convention Abolishing the Requirement of Legalization for Foreign Public Documents (hereinafter referred to as the Convention), which came into force on November 7 of the same year. The Convention is the international treaty with the widest scope of application and the largest number of contracting parties under the framework of the Hague Conference on Private International Law. It aims to simplify the procedures for the cross-border circulation of public documents, replace traditional consular certification with a more convenient way of certification, and promote international trade and personnel exchanges. Previously, if public documents needed to be used across borders, in addition to being notarized by local notarial agencies, they also needed to be legalized by consulates. The process was cumbersome and time-consuming. After the Convention came into effect, public documents sent from China to other contracting states shall only require an Apostille as prescribed by the Convention and may then be used directly in the receiving State without undergoing consular legalization by either Chinese authorities or the embassies/consulates of the destination country in China. Public documents sent from other Contracting States to Chinese Mainland for use shall only require an Apostille issued by the competent authority of the originating State, and are exempt from consular legalization by both the originating State's authorities and Chinese embassies/consulates in that country.

Both the US and China are parties to the Convention. Therefore, your power of attorney executed in the US only needs to go through notarization and subsequent apostille issuance by a US competent authority. This document may then be directly used in China without consular authentication by either the US federal authorities or Chinese embassies/consulates in the US. This streamlined process significantly reduces processing time. However, it should be noted that the traditional consular legalization procedures remain applicable to documents exchanged with states not acceding to the Convention.



(2) Apply for the owner's debit cards.

To facilitate the subsequent receipt of transaction funds, it is generally necessary to prepare a bank account opened in China. For example, in reality, if the buyer purchases a house using a provident fund loan, the seller needs to hold a local debit card to receive the loan from the local housing provident fund management center.

If it is inconvenient for you to open a bank account yourself and you entrust a trustee for the transaction, you need to pay attention to the policies of different banks. Currently, when applying for a new debit card, only some banks allow a trustee to handle the process by presenting the original ID card of the principal. Other banks only permit the issuance of a passbook, and the trustee must be present in person to apply for a debit card.

(3) Process the ownership transfer procedures.

After all documents are prepared, the seller can go to the housing management department with the power of attorney, notarization, property ownership certificate, and ID card to handle the ownership transfer formalities. When handling the transfer formalities, the seller should be present with the buyer to verify the identities of both parties.

Please note that if you are entrusted to sell a foreign national's property in China, the power of attorney must clearly state the location of the property, the trustee's authority to dispose of the property, and other matters of entrustment. At present, professional real estate lawyers generally have experience in handling various procedures for foreign nationals to sell houses in China. House-selling clients can consult in advance and then go through the relevant procedures.

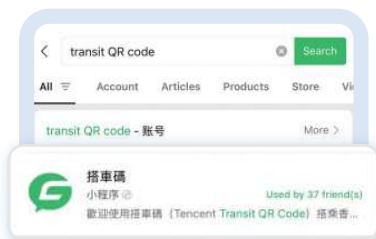




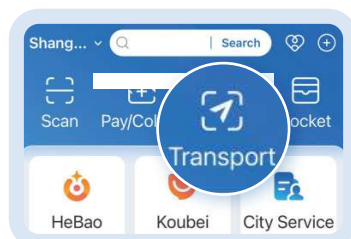
Bus and Subway

At present, urban public transportation services are available in all cities in China, and 55 cities have opened subways. If you choose to apply for a physical card, you can go to designated outlets such as bus stations, subway stations, and banks with a valid ID card. Some cities require a deposit when applying and have a minimum requirement for the first top-up. Please consult the relevant management agency in advance.

If you choose an online payment method such as a ride QR code, you can enter the "Transit QR Code" mini-program on WeChat or the "Transport" section on Alipay. After selecting your city, follow the instructions to apply for the card/code.

Bus cards can be obtained at subway stations, bus stops, or on mobile bus apps.

How to top up the bus card?

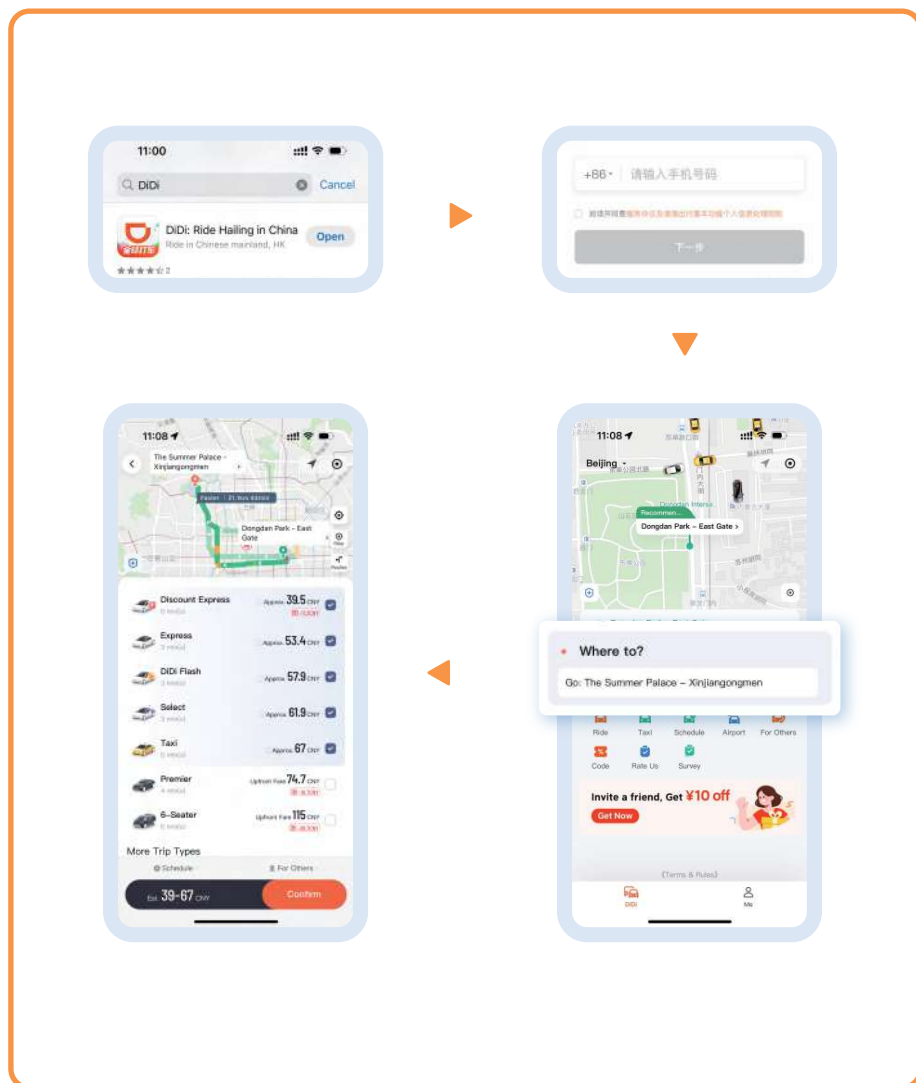
Bus cards can be topped up at any subway station or on the mobile bus app. You can use cash, WeChat, Alipay, and other payment methods supported by the mobile bus app.

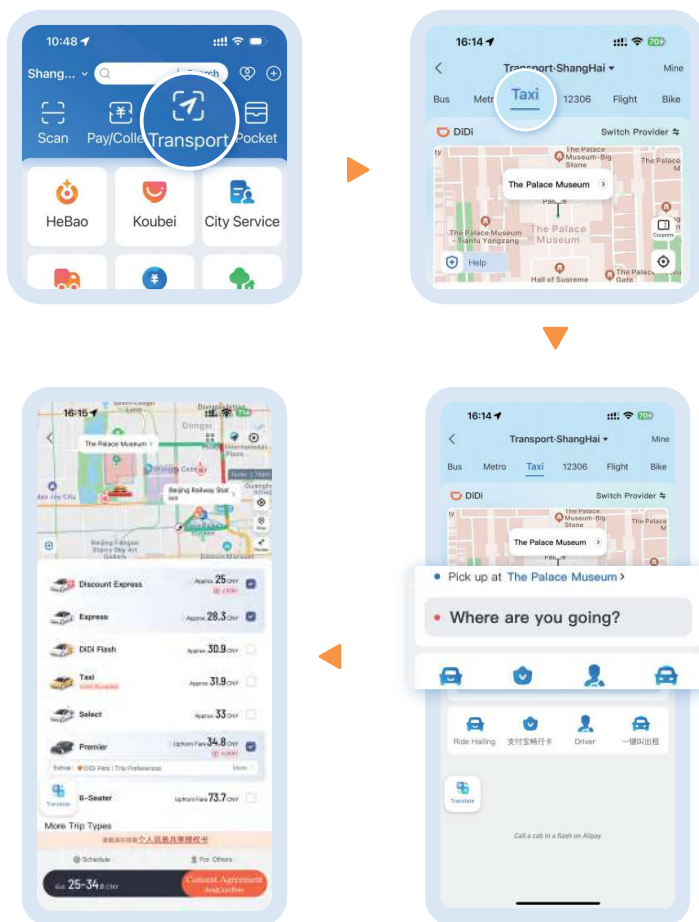

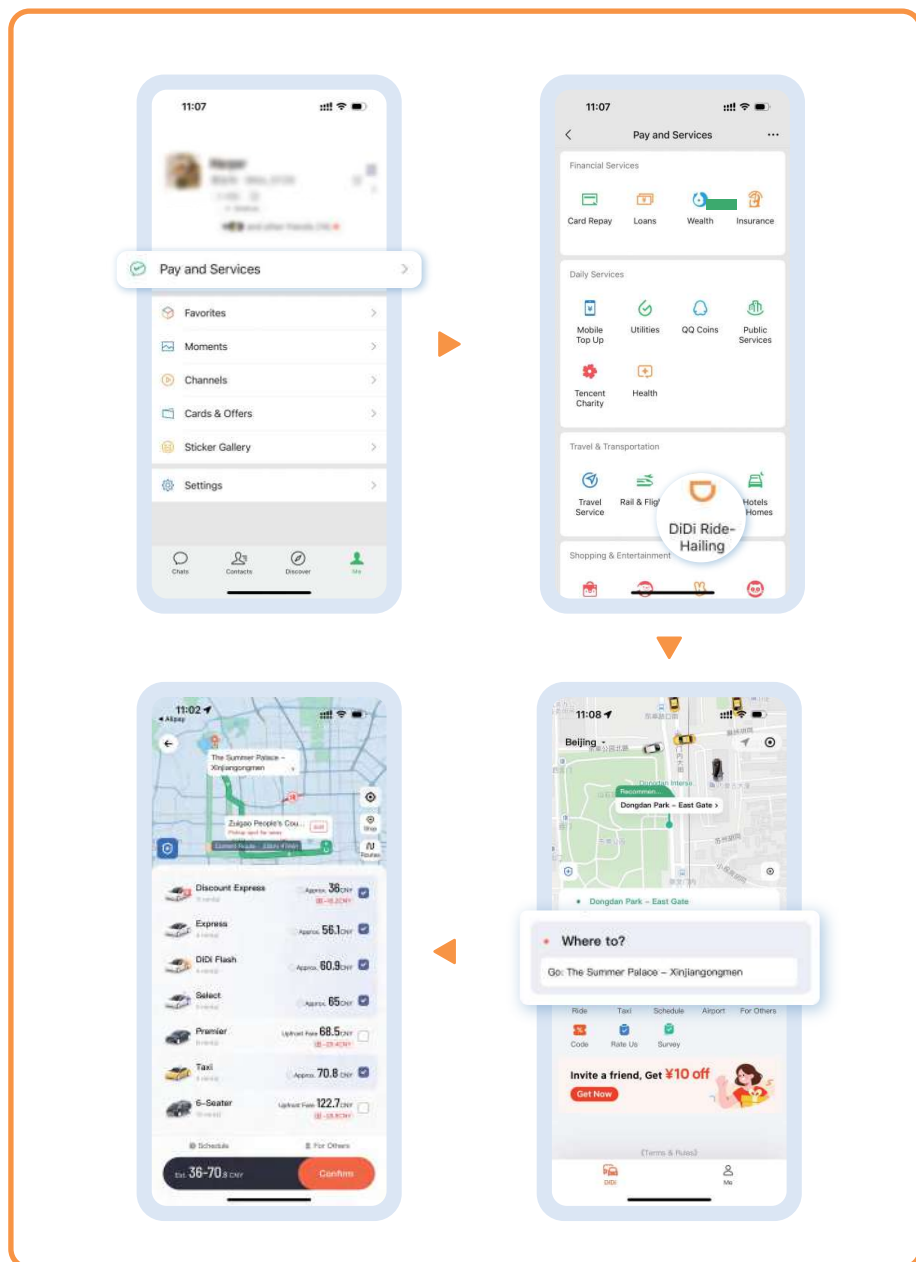
(1) Download the Didi Chuxing App. Currently, it supports registration using domestic and foreign mobile numbers and bank cards. It also supports payments via bank cards (including international cards such as Visa/MasterCard/JCB/Diners Club), WeChat, Alipay, digital RMB, and more. After registration, you can use the online car-hailing service. Open the App, confirm the pick-up location and destination, choose your preferred service (express, taxi, premium car, luxury car), and make a booking.



(2) Open the Alipay App, click "Transport", select "Taxi", enter the pick-up address and destination, and you can make a booking.



(3) Open the WeChat App, click "Me", select "Pay and Services", scroll down and select "Didi Chuxing" in the "Transportation" module, enter the pick-up address and destination respectively, and you can make a booking.



Shared Bike

When using a shared bicycle, you need to scan the vehicle QR code or enter the vehicle number in its app to unlock it. Once the bike is unlocked, the vehicle rental order will be valid, the order ends when you lock the bike. When the trip ends, the vehicle should be parked within the operating area. The payment should be made via channels available on the platform (including but not limited to WeChat, Alipay, credit card, debit card, etc.).

At present, the major shared bike operators in China are DiDi Bike, Meituan Bike, and Hellobike. Different operators have different service agreements, platform rules, personal information processing rules, and billing standards for rental and other related fees. For more details, you can read relevant information on official platforms such as mobile apps, mini-programs, official accounts, and portals.

Railway

China's railway passenger transport implements real-name ticket management. Foreign nationals can purchase tickets with their Foreign Permanent Resident ID Card, passport, entry-exit permit, acceptance receipt for foreigner's visa document issued by the public security organs or certification of passport loss report, or temporary international travel documents issued by embassies and consulates in China (with valid visas or stay permits issued by the public security bureau attached) under their real names. Passengers shall cooperate with security checks. Tips | Buying tickets with a Foreign Permanent Resident ID Card

Passengers holding a Foreign Permanent Resident ID Card can register and purchase tickets online. They can also complete real-name verification and ticket inspection by themselves at the station gates on their own. Additionally, they have access to the same online and self-service options provided by the railway department as those holding resident identity cards.

The railway department has launched an online identity verification service for foreign passports. Foreign passengers can log in to the 12306 website and fill in their name, nationality, ID number and other information according to the system prompts, and the system will automatically complete the identity verification. Passengers can also choose to submit photos of their passport information pages online for manual verification by the backend. In addition to online verification, passengers can still go to the ticketing counters for verification. Foreign passengers can only purchase tickets and board trains after passing their identity verification. Passengers holding foreign passports are requested to check the identity verification status promptly and complete the identity information verification as soon as possible to avoid any issues with ticket purchases and travel.



Foreign passengers can purchase train tickets online through the English version of the 12306 website or the 12306 App, or directly at the ticketing counters of the railway station. To pick up paper tickets for boarding, foreign passengers are required to bring their passports to the ticketing counters or a ticket agency.

Foreign nationals in China can purchase air tickets through formal channels, such as airline ticket offices, official websites, mobile clients (official accounts, apps), etc., with a valid identification document (the Civil Aviation Security Inspection Rules stipulate that the valid identification documents for foreign passengers include passports, Diplomatic Identity Card issued by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and Foreign Permanent Resident ID Card), and go through check-in and registration procedures with the above-mentioned valid documents.

When purchasing tickets or before traveling, you should consult the airline or log on to the official website to find relevant regulations on baggage transportation, including checked baggage size, weight, free baggage allowance, excess baggage fees, prohibited items, etc.

Driving

Renewal of Overseas Driving License

(1) People holding a foreign driving license, meeting the application requirements of the Provisions on the Application for and Use of Motor Vehicle Driving Licenses, and having accumulated at least 90 days of residence in the issuing country or region within the year prior to obtaining the driving license, can apply for a driving license for the corresponding permitted vehicle type. Those who apply for a driving license for a large passenger vehicle, heavy tractor-trailer, or medium-sized passenger vehicle shall have obtained a foreign driving license for the corresponding permitted vehicle type for more than 2 years.

(2) People holding a foreign driving license who need to drive a motor vehicle temporarily shall apply for a temporary driving permit from the Vehicle Management Office in accordance with regulations.

(3) Those who enter China for a short stay can apply for a temporary driving permit with a validity period of 3 months; if the stay period exceeds 3 months, the validity period can be extended to 1 year.

If the holder of a temporary driving permit accumulates 12 points within a scoring period and fails to participate in the required study and examination of road traffic safety laws, regulations and related knowledge as required, they shall not be allowed to apply for a driving license or a temporary driving permit again.

(4) Foreign nationals applying for a driving license shall submit their application at their place of residence or domicile.

(5) When people holding a foreign driving license apply for a driving license in China, they shall confirm the application information and submit the following certificates and credentials:

- Identity certificate of the applicant;
- Certificate of physical conditions issued by a medical institution;
- Driving license. If it is not in Chinese, a Chinese translation issued by a translation agency or notarized by a notary office shall also be provided.

Applications from workers of foreign embassies and consulates in China and representative offices of international organizations in China will be processed in accordance with the principle of diplomatic reciprocity.

(6) If you apply for a driving license in China with a foreign driving license, you shall take the test for Subject 1. If you apply for a driving license for a large passenger vehicle, heavy tractor-trailer, city bus, medium-sized passenger vehicle, or large truck, you shall take the test for Subject 1, 2, and 3.

Applications from workers of foreign embassies and consulates in China and representative offices of international organizations in China shall be processed in accordance with the principle of diplomatic reciprocity.

(7) If you apply for a driving license in China with a foreign driving license, you shall complete the subject examination required within 3 years from the date of acceptance by the Vehicle Management Office.



Apply for a temporary driving permit in China

Take your passport, valid visa and other identity documents, and your foreign driving license to the Vehicle Management Office of the traffic management department of the public security agency at the place of entry or residence, and you can apply for a temporary driving permit for a small-sized vehicle or motorcycle. If the foreign driving license is not in Chinese, a Chinese translation should also be provided.

The temporary driving permit can be used multiple times within the validity period without re-application. A person holding a temporary driving permit can drive his or her own temporarily imported motor vehicle or a rented Chinese motor vehicle.

If you drive your own temporarily imported motor vehicle, the type of vehicle that you are allowed to drive with the provisional driving license should be the same as the type of vehicle that you are bringing in. If you drive a leased Chinese motor vehicle, the type of vehicle that you are allowed to drive with the temporary driving permit is a small-sized vehicle or a small-sized vehicle with auto transmission.

Apply for A Chinese Driving License

Apply for a driving license at the Vehicle Management Office in your place of residence with your passport, a valid visa with a period of stay or residence for more than three months (inclusive) or other valid identification documents such as a stay or residence permit, a foreign driving license, as well as certificates of accommodation registration issued by the public security organs and relevant physical condition certificates issued by a medical institution at or above the county level.



Obtain A Driving License in China

If you are 18 years of age or above, you can apply for a driving license at the Vehicle Management Office in your place of stay or residence with your passport, a valid visa with a period of stay or residence for more than three months (inclusive) or other valid identification documents such as a stay or residence permit, as well as certificates of accommodation registration issued by the public security organs and relevant physical condition certificates issued by a medical institution at or above the county level. After passing the test, you can obtain a formal Chinese driving license.



Buy a Car in China

In some cities in China, you need to apply for and obtain a passenger car license plate quota first before purchasing a vehicle. If you need to purchase a passenger car in China, you need to contact the local transportation administrative department for detailed information. After purchasing one, you need to complete the procedures for license plate registration or second-hand car transfer with a valid ID document, such as a passport, a Foreign Permanent Resident ID Card, and other materials required by the local authorities.

Category

Emergency

- (1) Dial the emergency number 120, clearly describe your address and wait for the ambulance. However, the 120 emergency line currently does not provide multilingual services;
- (2) Seek medical treatment at the emergency department of the nearest facility. The department operates on a 24/7 basis.

Non-emergency

- (1) Public hospitals: Government-run hospitals are the mainstay of China's medical service system. Grade 3A hospitals are the most authoritative hospitals. Some hospitals also provide online appointment services. You can log on to the hospital website or download the hospital app to make an appointment. Some public hospitals have international departments that provide medical services to foreign nationals who need medical treatment;
- (2) Private hospitals: Non-government-run hospitals. In China, many private hospitals offer world-class diagnostic and treatment services and provide language services.

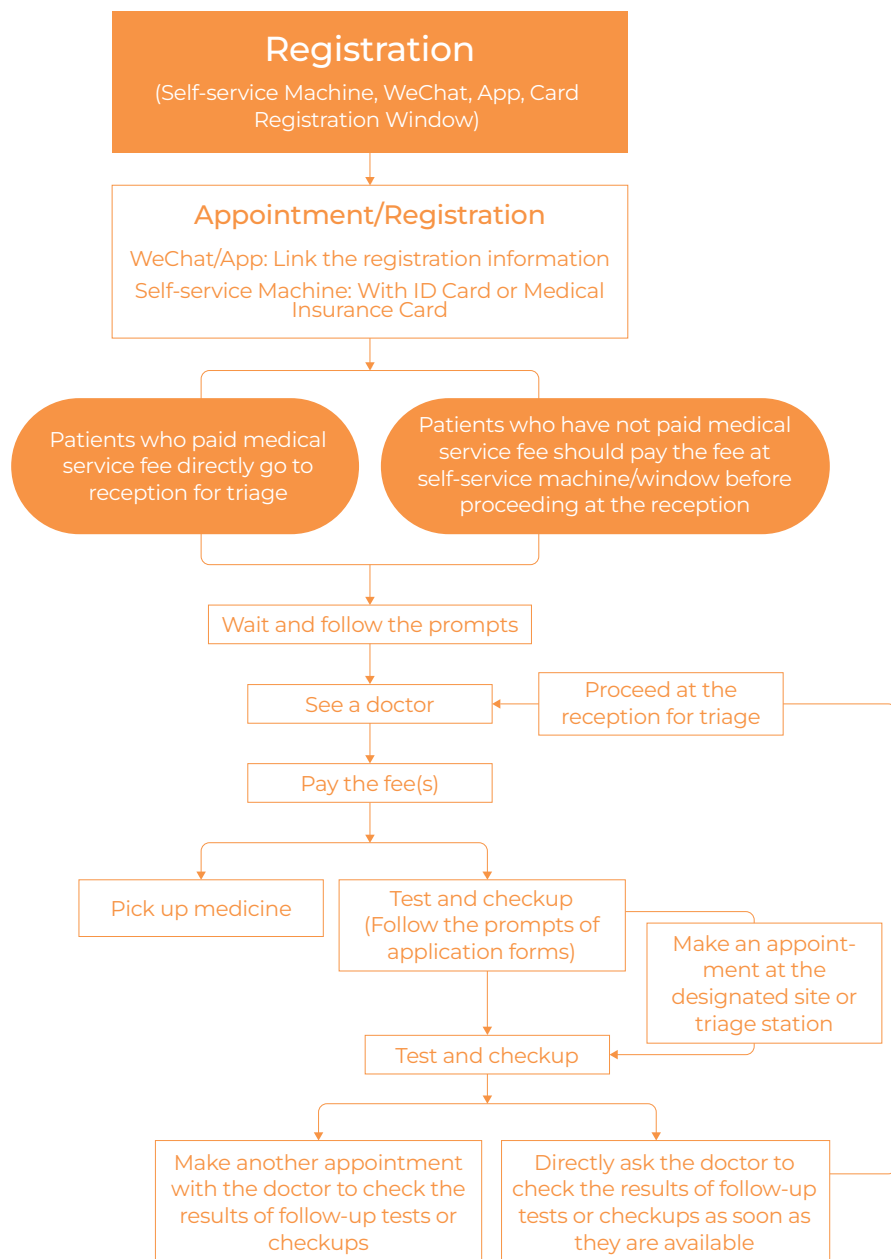
Tips

Childbirth: Both public and private hospitals offer childbirth services. Hospitals with the necessary conditions may allow family members to accompany the mother during delivery. Doctors will decide whether a cesarean section is necessary based on the mother's physical condition. Please note that pregnant women usually need to prepare their own pajamas, towels, baby diapers and other supplies.

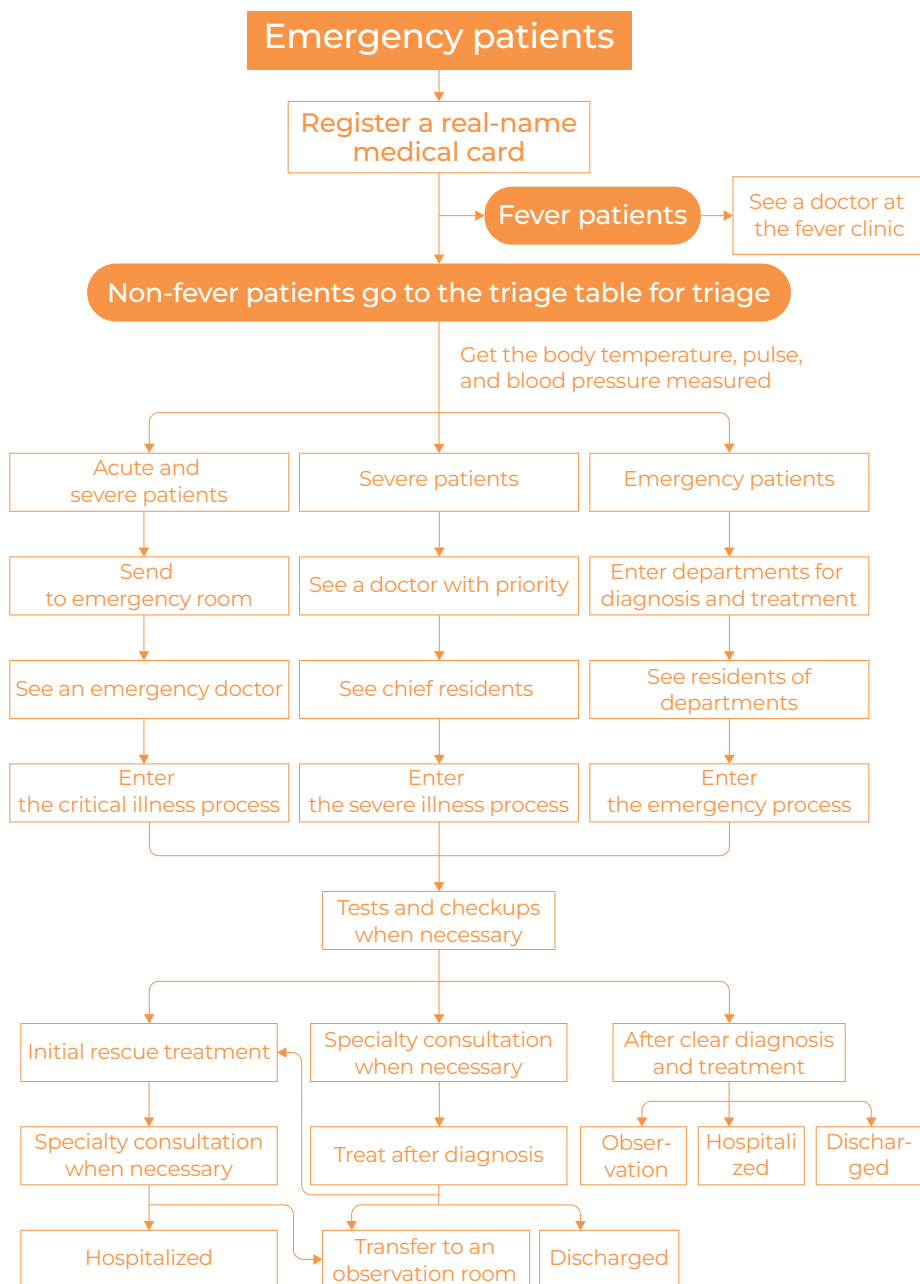
Health Check-up: Foreign nationals who have resided in China for one year or more are required to undergo a health check-up. You can visit the official website of the International Travel Health Care Center at various locations to obtain information on health check-ups.

Tips

Before visiting a private hospital, international medical department, or special outpatient medical department, it is recommended to make an appointment first. The following three methods are commonly used:

First, log on to WeChat or Alipay app or directly download the hospital's official app (some hospitals have English interfaces) and make an appointment;

Second, call the hospital's dedicated appointment number to make an appointment;

Third, make an appointment at the hospital outpatient building's manual service counter or self-service registration machine.

After making an appointment, you can refer to the public hospital's medical treatment procedures and go to the relevant department of the hospital at the appointment time. At that time, medical staff will also guide you through subsequent procedures.

Medical Insurance

Employee Basic Medical Insurance

According to Article 4 of the Interim Measures for Social Insurance System Coverage of Foreigners Working within the Territory of China issued by the Ministry of Human Resources and Social Security, the employer who hires foreigners shall process social insurance registration for the foreigners recruited and employed within 30 days from the date of processing their employment permits. For foreigners dispatched by their overseas employers to work at host service entities, the host service entities shall process social insurance registration on their behalf in accordance with the preceding paragraph. Foreigners employed within the territory of China refer to non-Chinese nationals who have lawfully obtained employment certificates, such as the Foreigner's Work Permit, the Press Card for Resident Foreign Correspondent, as well as residence permits, and those who hold the Foreign Permanent Resident ID Card and are lawfully employed within the territory of China.

Foreign nationals participating in the employee basic medical insurance can present their medical insurance card or electronic medical insurance certificate when settling medical expenses at designated medical institutions. The medical insurance payment part will be transferred from the medical insurance pooling account, and the personal payment part may be directly deducted from the personal account balance (under special circumstances, medical expenses that meet the medical insurance reimbursement scope but are fully paid by the individual can be manually reimbursed by the employer at the medical insurance center in the insured area).

Many foreign nationals choose to purchase medical insurance, and sometimes employers provide medical insurance as part of their employee benefits. You can choose to purchase medical insurance from local or foreign insurance companies. Please note that some public hospitals in China do not recognize medical insurance from foreign insurance companies. When signing a contract with an insurance company, you need to confirm the hospital you are insured for, the type of disease, and other matters. When you see a doctor, please remember to ask for a payment invoice so that you can claim reimbursement from the insurance company later.



Commercial Insurance

Commercially insured patients should confirm the claim scope and requirements of the commercial insurance they purchased before seeing a doctor. If you have any questions, please contact your insurance company in a timely manner.

Commercially insured patients need to bring their valid identification documents (ID card, passport, etc.) and insurance card when seeking medical treatment.

Patients with commercial insurance need to confirm whether the insurance company can pay directly. If the contracted insurance company is on the list of direct billing partners of the hospital where they are treated and has set open the direct settlement function, they can settle the bill directly at the hospital. Otherwise, they will need to pay the medical expenses upfront and then file a claim with the insurance company later.



Tips | Commercial Insurance Claims

The information that needs to be submitted when applying for a claim usually includes outpatient and inpatient medical records, detailed expense lists, medical expense invoices, diagnosis certificates, examination and test reports, etc. Please refer to the insurance company's requirements for specific details.

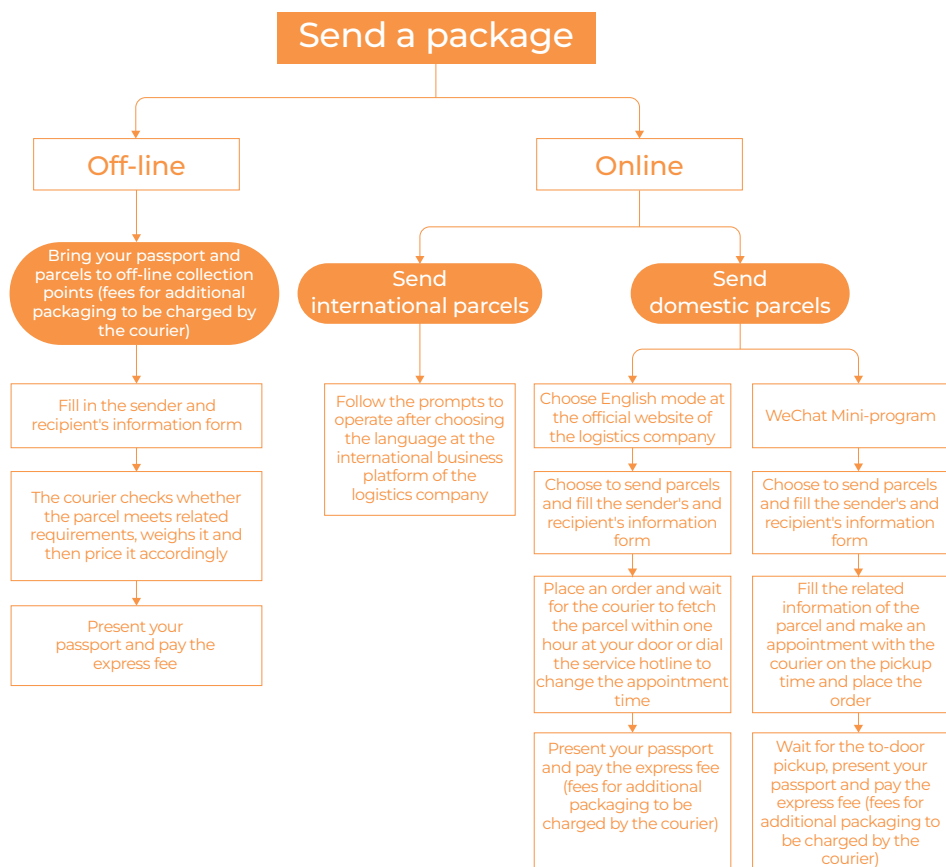
When the insurance company reviews your medical expenses, if it finds any part beyond the claim scope, it will contact you to return the corresponding expenses to the insurance company (some insurance companies will entrust resident representatives to collect them).

The Regulations on the Real-Name Collection and Delivery of Express Packages stipulates that when collecting and sending express packages, the sender is required to present a valid identification document and truthfully fill out the detailed delivery form, express waybill and other documents.

The valid identification documents that foreign nationals need to produce when sending express packages include (one of the following): Foreign Permanent Resident ID Card, passport, entry-exit permit, acceptance receipt for foreigner's visa document issued by the public security organs, certification of passport loss report, provisional international travel documents issued by embassies and consulates of various countries in China (they shall be accompanied by a valid visa or stay permit issued by the public security organs).

If you need to send an express parcel, you may use the express company's official App, WeChat public account, WeChat Mini-program and other channels to place orders. When placing an order, you need to fill in the delivery address, choose door-to-door pickup, outlet self-delivery or other pickup methods as needed, and fill in the item information truthfully. Delivered items shall comply with the prohibition and restriction regulations. Firearms (including replicas, and major components), ammunition, controlled instruments, explosives, flammable liquids and other items are prohibited from being delivered. For details, please refer to the official website of each courier company.

Prohibition and Restriction on Delivery

Prohibited and restricted items include:

- (1) Weapons, imitation weapons, ammunition, controlled devices and explosives;
- (2) Inflammable and explosive articles;
- (3) Oxidants and peroxides;
- (4) Narcotic drugs and drug-taking paraphernalia, narcotic drugs and psychotropic drugs for improper use, precursor chemicals for improper use, and toxic substances;
- (5) Biochemical products, infectious and contagious substances;
- (6) Corrosive substances and radioactive substances;
- (7) All kinds of illegal publications, printed materials, audio-visual products and other materials that endanger national security and social stability;
- (8) Documents, materials and other items containing state secrets;
- (9) Equipment used exclusively for espionage;
- (10) Forged or altered currency, securities, certificates, official seals, or other illegally forged items;
- (11) Currency and securities;
- (12) Infringement of intellectual property rights and counterfeit and shoddy goods;
- (13) Animals and plants, especially endangered wild animals and plants and their products;
- (14) Food, medicine or other items that are harmful to human and animal health, come from epidemic areas or may spread diseases;
- (15) Tobacco products and alcohol;
- (16) Valuable items (e.g., artworks, antiques, gemstones, and precious metals such as gold);
- (17) Other prohibited items stipulated in Chinese laws and regulations.

In addition to the above-mentioned prohibited/restricted items, the courier company also has the right to refuse to deliver or suspend the delivery of the following items:

- (1) Any parcel that does not provide detailed contact information of the sender and recipient;
- (2) Items that are unsuitable for delivery or have not been properly described, classified, packaged, labeled, and provided with the necessary documentation for mailing;
- (3) Items that are considered to be potentially hazardous to the safety of vehicles or people due to the characteristics of the product itself or its packaging;
- (4) Items that are deemed unsuitable for delivery from an economic or operational perspective.

Chinese Currency

The legal tender of the People's Republic of China is Renminbi, with the unit being Yuan, and the sub-units are Jiao and Fen. One Yuan equals 10 Jiao, and one Jiao equals 10 Fen.



Currency Exchange

Before entry: Any amount exceeding the equivalent of USD 5,000 shall be declared to the customs in writing, except for multiple round trips on the same day or multiple round trips within a short period of time.

After entry:

The institution for handling foreign exchange—Banks (please note that they do not exchange foreign currency with unqualified individuals or companies).

Documents to bring—Valid ID cards.

Quota limit—For foreign exchange settlement, an annual facilitation quota of USD 50,000 per person per year is implemented. Within the facilitation quota, transactions may be processed at the bank with a valid ID card. If beyond the facilitation quota, transactions may be processed at the bank with a valid ID card and relevant supporting documents. In addition, if a foreign national holds a Foreign Permanent Resident ID Card, the annual facilitation quota of USD 50,000 per person per year is applicable for foreign exchange settlement and purchase.

 Tips

The current version of the Foreign Permanent Resident ID Card of the People's Republic of China was officially issued and put into use on December 1, 2023. The Foreign Permanent Resident ID card may be used as an identity document to handle securities and futures transactions, as well as the subscription and redemption of investment fund shares. Many securities companies have launched their online account opening functions for foreign nationals holding the new version of the Foreign Permanent Resident ID Card.

Applicable Laws on International Marriage

- Conditions of marriage are governed by the law of the parties' common habitual residence. Absent common habitual residence, the law of their common nationality shall be applied. Absent common nationality, the law of the place where the marriage is concluded shall be applied, if the marriage is concluded in a party's habitual residence or in the country of a party's nationality.
- Formalities of marriage are valid if they conform to the laws of the locality where the marriage is concluded, or the laws of a party's habitual residence or nationality.
- Personal relation of spouses is governed by the law of their common habitual residence. Absent common habitual residence, the law of their common nationality shall be applied.
- In respect of spousal property, the parties may by agreement choose to apply the law of a party's habitual residence or nationality, or the law of the place where the main property locates. Absent any choice by the parties, the law of their common habitual residence shall be applied; absent common habitual residence, the law of their common nationality shall be applied.
- Personal and property relations between parents and children are governed by the law of their common habitual residence. Absent common habitual residence, the law of a party's habitual residence or nationality, which better protects the rights and interests of the weaker party, shall be applied.
- In respect of consented divorce, the parties may by agreement choose to apply the law of a party's habitual residence or nationality. Absent any choice by the parties, the law of their common habitual residence shall be applied; absent common habitual residence, the law of their common nationality shall be applied; absent common nationality, the law of the place where the agency responsible for completing the divorce formalities locates shall be applied.
- Divorce decided by a court is governed by the law of the forum.

Marriage Registration

Documents Required for Marriage Registration

- (1) The applicant's valid passport or other valid international travel documents;
- (2) A Certificate of No Spouse issued by a notarial authority or competent authority in the country of residence, which has been authenticated either by the Embassy/Consulate of the People's Republic of China in that country or by the Embassy/Consulate of that country in China; alternatively, a Certificate of No Spouse issued directly by the Embassy/Consulate of that country in China.

Where an international treaty concluded or acceded to by the People's Republic of China provides otherwise, the certification procedures stipulated in such treaty shall apply. The parties applying for marriage registration shall be responsible for the authenticity of the certificates issued by foreign authorities under the relevant international treaties, sign a written statement to this effect, and bear corresponding legal liabilities.

Registration Location

For the marriage between a Chinese citizen and a foreigner in Chinese mainland, both parties shall jointly apply for marriage registration at the civil affairs department of the mainland citizen's permanent residence.

Tips | Can both parties be foreigners and register for marriage in China?

According to the Ministry of Civil Affairs Announcement No. 456 (March 29, 2019), "the certification materials submitted by the country of origin of non-mainland residents when registering their marriage in the mainland to prove the validity of their marriage registration abroad" will no longer be processed and will be directly canceled due to a lack of legal basis. After the cancellation, marriage registration for foreigners will no longer be processed in China.

Divorce Registration

Documents Required for Divorce Registration

- (1) The applicant's valid passports or other valid international travel documents;
- (2) The applicant's marriage certificate;
- (3) Divorce agreement signed by both parties.

Registration Location

For a voluntary divorce between a Chinese citizen and a foreigner in the Chinese mainland, both parties shall jointly apply for divorce registration at the civil affairs department of the mainland citizen's permanent residence.

Tips | Can both parties be foreigners and register for divorce in China?

If both parties are foreigners or stateless persons and apply for divorce in China, and their marriage was contracted abroad, Chinese courts generally do not accept the case. However, there are three exceptions:

First, if it is determined that one of the parties is domiciled or resident in China, the Chinese court shall have jurisdiction;

Second, if the two parties reach a divorce agreement, the Chinese court can accept the case and take jurisdiction. When the two parties have reached a consensus on the divorce issues, generally, the domestic court can accept the preparation of a civil mediation document;

Third, the jurisdiction of the response. According to Article 234 of the Civil Procedure Law of the People's Republic of China: "If in a civil action in respect of a case involving foreign element, the defendant raises no object to the jurisdiction of a people's court and responds to the action by making his defence, he shall be deemed to have accepted that this people's court has jurisdiction over the case."

Birth Registration

Foreign infants born in China will not obtain Chinese nationality, but they need to apply for birth registration and a visa. Article 40 of the Exit and Entry Administration Law of the People's Republic of China stipulates that for foreign infants born in China, their parents or agents shall, within 60 days after they are born, on the strength of the birth certificates, go through the formalities for stay/residence registration for them with the exit/entry administrations of public security organs under people's governments at or above the county level in the places of their parents' stay or residence.

To register, you need to provide a birth certificate of the foreign infant, as well as the passports and visas of both parents. You may also need to submit other materials in accordance with local requirements. For detailed requirements, please visit the official website of the local government or call the local public security organ/police station for consultation.

Death Registration

For foreigners who decease in China, their relatives, guardians or agents shall, in accordance with relevant regulations, on the strength of the medical certificates of death, report their death to the exit/entry administrations of the public security organs under local people's governments at or above the county level to cancel their stay or residence permits.

(1) The aftermath of the death of a foreigner in China shall be handled by his or her employer if there is one; otherwise, the public security organs shall handle the matter together with relevant departments.

(2) If the death is due to natural causes, the family members, guardians, or agents of the deceased shall bring the deceased's passport and medical certificate of death to the exit-entry administration authorities of the public security organ of the local people's government at or above the county level to report the death and cancel the foreigner's stay/residence permit.

If the death is unnatural, the relevant person or the discoverer shall immediately report it to the public security organ. The criminal investigation department of the public security organ or the forensic doctor of the judicial organ shall determine the cause of death based on the results of the on-site investigation or autopsy and issue a relevant appraisal opinion. After applying for a medical certificates of death from the Center for Disease Control and Prevention, it shall be reported to the exit-entry administration authorities of the public security organ of the local people's government at or above the county level, and the foreigner's stay/residence permit shall be canceled.

(3) The handling of the bodies of foreigners who died in China should respect the wishes of the deceased's family or the embassy or consulate of their country in China. The bodies may be cremated locally or sent back to their home country.

If cremation is required, the deceased's family members, guardians, or agents should go to the funeral home with relevant certificates to go through the cremation procedures.

The transportation of corpses out of the country shall be handled by the family of the deceased or their authorized agents in accordance with relevant regulations of China through the local international corpse transportation carrier set up by the International Corpse Transportation Network Service Center of the China Funeral Association. When the coffin is transported out of China, it is necessary to hold a medical certificate of death or death appraisal, a certificate of embalming issued by the funeral parlor, and a coffin export permit issued by the health and epidemic prevention department.

Dog Keeping Tips



Most cities in China prohibit the keeping of fierce dogs and large dogs such as Tibetan mastiffs, Rottweilers, and pit bulls, and have made regulations on the adult height of dogs allowed to be kept and the list of banned dogs. Some cities are divided into key management areas and general management areas, and the prohibition requirements in key management areas are stricter. The Civil Code of the People's Republic of China stipulates that if dangerous animals such as fierce dogs that are prohibited from being kept cause damage to others, the animal breeder or manager shall bear tortious liability. If you need to keep a dog, please check the local dog management regulations in advance, or consult the local public security and other competent departments for details.

Notarization Acceptance Conditions

China's Rules for Notarization Procedure clearly state that notarization matters should be accepted by the notarial agency at the place of residence, habitual residence, place of conduct, or place of occurrence of the applicant. When applying for notarization from a notarial agency, one should fill in the notarization application form, and also submit their identity certificates, the document for notarization application, and supporting materials. If the application is entrusted to another person, the agent shall submit the authorization letter of the third party. Notarial agencies may accept applications that meet the following conditions:

- (1) The applicant has an interest in the matter for which notarization is sought;
- (2) There is no dispute between the applicants regarding the matters for notarization;
- (3) The matters for which notarization is applied are within the prescribed scope;
- (4) The matter for which notarization is applied complies with relevant regulations and the scope of notarization services that the notarial office may accept within its practice area.

Scope of Notarization

Based on applications from natural persons, legal persons, or other organizations, notarial agencies shall perform notarial acts for the following notarial matters:

- (1) Contracts;
- (2) Inheritance;
- (3) Authorization, declarations, bestowal, wills;
- (4) Distribution of property;
- (5) Tendering and auctioning;
- (6) Marital status, kinship, and adoption relationships;
- (7) Birth, existence, death, identity, experience, education, degrees, positions, titles, and criminal records;
- (8) Articles of associations;
- (9) Preservation of evidence;
- (10) The signature, seal, and date on documents, and copies or photocopies of the documents are consistent with the original;

(11) Other notarial matters voluntarily applied for by natural persons, legal persons, or other organizations.

For matters that shall be notarized as required by laws and administrative regulations, the relevant natural persons, legal persons, or other organizations shall apply to a notary agency for notarization.

If you need notarization services, you may initiate an online notarization application in the Notarization module of the China Legal Services Network, or you may search for an offline notary office in your city and go there for the due procedures.

Notarial Agencies for Application

(1) A natural person, legal person, or other organization may apply for notarization at a notarial office at their place of residence, habitual residence, place of conduct or place where the facts occurred;

(2) Applications for notarization involving real estate should be submitted to the notary office where the real estate is located;

(3) Applications for notarization involving real estate, such as powers of attorney, declarations, gifts, or wills, may be governed by the provisions of paragraph (2).

Illegal Residence

Foreigners who stay or reside in China shall not engage in activities that are inconsistent with the purpose of their stay or residence and shall leave China before the expiration of the prescribed stay or residence period. Foreigners who have any of the following circumstances in China shall be deemed to be illegally residing:

- (1) Staying or residing beyond the duration specified in his or her visa, stay/residence permit;
- (2) Overstaying the visa-free period and failing to obtain a stay/residence permit;
- (3) The activities of foreigners go beyond the restricted area of stay/residence;
- (4) Other circumstances where foreigners reside illegally.

Tips

Depending on the severity of the situation, foreigners who reside illegally may face penalties such as warnings, fines, limited-time departure orders, and deportation.

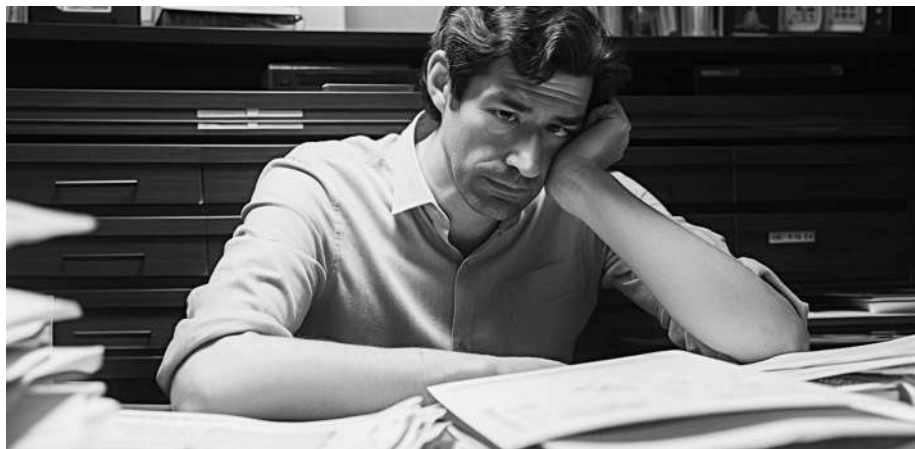
Illegal Employment

Any of the following acts of foreigners shall be deemed unlawful employment:

- (1) Working in China without obtaining work permits or work-type residence permits in accordance with relevant regulations;
- (2) Working in China beyond the scope prescribed in the work permit;
- (3) Foreign students work in violation of the regulations on the administration of foreign students working to support their study in China and work beyond the prescribed scope of jobs or prescribed time limit.

Tips

Unlawfully employed foreigners, individuals (entities) who introduce jobs to ineligible foreigners, and those individuals or entities that illegally employ foreigners may face fines of RMB 5,000 to 100,000, detention for 5 to 15 days, deportation, and other penalties, depending on the severity.



Others

Disturbing Noise

According to Article 58 of the Law on Penalties for Administration of Public Security: A person who, in violation of the provisions of the law on prevention and control of pollution by the noise emitted in the course of social activities, makes noise to impair the daily life of another person shall be given a warning; and if he fails to make amends after the warning, he shall be fined not less than 200 yuan but not more than 500 yuan.

Narcotics

Narcotics, as defined by Chinese law, refer to opium, heroin, methamphetamine (Ice), morphine, cannabis (marijuana), cocaine, and other narcotic and psychotropic substances that are state-regulated and addictive.

Drunk

If you are drunk and pose a threat to yourself, the lives of others, property or public safety, protective measures will be taken to restrain you until you regain sobriety.

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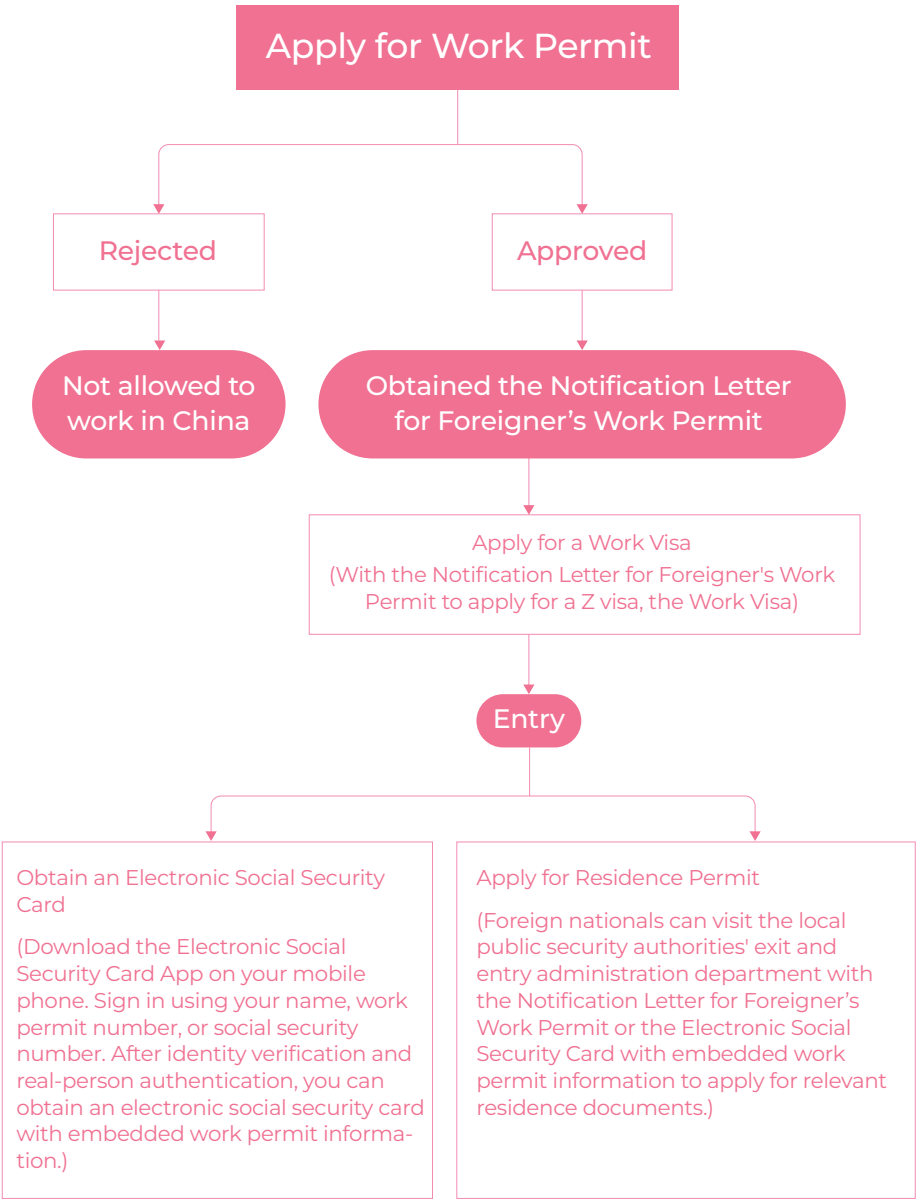
WORK IN CHINA



Work in China

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Foreigners who work in China shall obtain work permits in accordance with relevant regulations. Those coming to China for short-term work assignments and foreign university graduates seeking employment in China should also obtain relevant qualifications.



Application Requirements

Foreign nationals shall meet the following conditions to work in China:

- (1) Aged 18 or above and in good health;
- (2) Possess the necessary professional skills and relevant work experience to perform the job;
- (3) No criminal record;
- (4) Have a confirmed employer;
- (5) Hold a valid passport or other passport-equivalent travel document.

Application Materials

Materials required for applying for the Notification Letter for Foreigner's Work Permit (for working in China for more than 90 days (exclusive))

- (1) *Application Form for Foreigner's Work Permit* (for working in China for more than 90 days (exclusive));
- (2) Proof of work experience;
- (3) Highest degree (educational qualification) certificate or relevant approval documents, professional qualification certificate;
- (4) Certificate of No Criminal Record;
- (5) Certificate of Physical Examination;
- (6) Employment contract or employment certificate (including a dispatch letter from a multinational company);
- (7) Applicant's passport or international travel documents;
- (8) A front-facing bare-headed photo of the applicant taken within six months;
- (9) Relevant certification documents of accompanying family members.

Documents required for applying for a Notification Letter for Foreigner's Work Permit (for working in China for up to 90 days, inclusive) or an Invitation Letter for Foreign Experts to China

- (1) Notification Letter for Foreigner's Work Permit (for working in China for up to 90 days, inclusive) or an Invitation Letter for Foreign Experts to China;
- (2) Employment contract, project contract, cooperation agreement or invitation statement of the inviting entity;
- (3) Applicant's passport or international travel document.

Work Permit Application

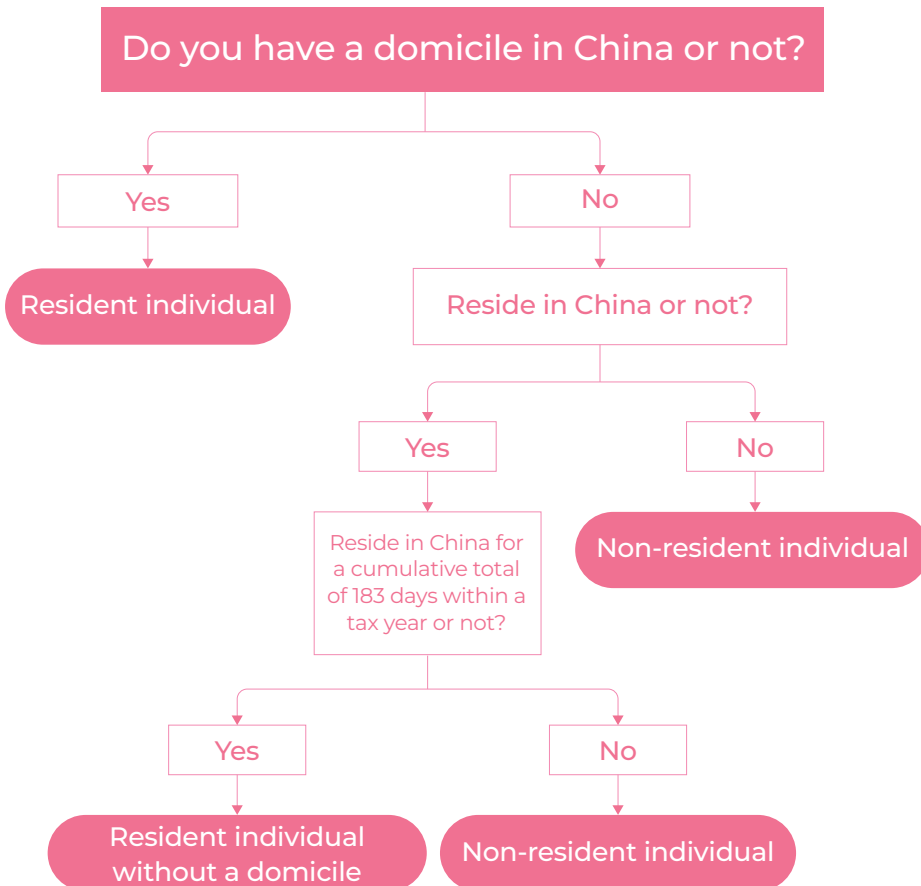
The application, extension, change and cancellation of work permits are all handled online in the Management and Service System for Foreigners Working in China. Foreigners do not need to apply for a physical work permit after entering China. For those who have already obtained a physical work permit, in accordance with the principle of "no change, no renewal", when applying for an extension or change of the existing work permit, follow the new procedures for the integration of the certificate and the card.



Resident Individuals and Non-Resident Individuals

Foreign nationals working in China shall pay individual income tax in accordance with the Individual Income Tax Law of the People's Republic of China.

An individual who is domiciled in China, or an individual who is not domiciled in China but has resided in China for an aggregate of 183 days or more within a tax year, shall be regarded as a resident individual. An individual who is not domiciled in China and does not reside in China, or an individual who is not domiciled in China but has resided in China for less than an accumulated 183 days within a tax year, shall be regarded as a non-resident individual.



Taxable Scope

The following categories of individual income shall be subject to individual income tax:

- (1) Income from wages and salaries;
- (2) Income from remuneration for personal services;
- (3) Income from author's remuneration;
- (4) Income from royalties;
- (5) Income from business income;
- (6) Income from interest, dividends and bonuses;
- (7) Income from leasing of assets;
- (8) Income from transfer of assets; and
- (9) Incidental income.

For forms of income (1) through (4) in the preceding paragraph (hereinafter collectively referred to as "Comprehensive Income") earned by a resident individual, they shall be aggregated on a tax year basis to calculate the individual income tax payable while the same earned by a non-resident individual shall be calculated separately on a monthly or transaction basis. For forms of income (5) through (9) in the preceding paragraph, the individual income tax payable shall be calculated separately pursuant to the provisions of this Law.

Individual Income Tax Rates

- (1) For comprehensive income in excess of the specified amounts, progressive tax rates ranging from 3 percent to 45 percent shall apply;
- (2) For income from business operation in excess of the specified amounts, progressive tax rates ranging from 5 percent to 35 percent shall apply (see schedule of tax rates attached); and
- (3) For income from interest, dividends or bonuses, income from leasing of assets, income from transfer of assets, and incidental income, a flat tax rate of 20 percent shall apply.

Individual Income Tax Preferential Policies

Where the number of years in each of which an individual who does not have residence in China has stayed for a total of 183 days or more in China is less than 6 years consecutively, he or she may, after filing a report with the tax authority having jurisdiction, be exempt from individual income tax on his or her income derived from outside China paid by overseas entities or individuals.

An individual who does not have a residence in China and has stayed in China for a total of less than 90 days during a tax year shall be exempt from individual income tax on the part of his or her income which is derived from inside China and paid by employer outside China and not borne by the employer's institutions or venues inside China.

Reasonable housing, food, and laundry allowances received by foreign individuals in non-cash or reimbursement form shall be exempt from individual income tax. Taxpayers shall, when filing salary income tax returns in the month following the initial receipt or any change in amount/payment method of such allowances, submit supporting documents to the competent tax authorities for verification and tax-exemption approval.

Relocation income reimbursed to foreign individuals for assuming or leaving positions in China shall be tax-exempt for the reasonable part, subject to submission of valid supporting documents and approval by the tax authorities. However, monthly/regular payments labeled as "relocation expenses" by foreign-invested enterprises to foreign employees shall be taxed as salary income.

Domestic and overseas business trip subsidies received by foreign individuals at reasonable standards shall be exempt from individual income tax. The taxpayer shall submit supporting documents (photocopies of transportation/accommodation invoices or the company's official travel itinerary) to the competent tax authorities for tax-exemption approval.

Foreign individuals shall be exempt from tax on family visit travel expenses, provided that they submit photocopies of transportation receipts. The exemption applies only to expenses verified by the tax authorities as genuinely used for personal visits, with a reasonable frequency and expenditure limit annually.

Language training fees and children's education subsidies for studies in China shall be tax-exempt within reasonable limits. Taxpayers shall provide valid expenditure vouchers and proof of education duration to the tax authorities for review.

Tips

1. Criteria for determining the length of residence of individuals without domicile in China:

(1) Where an individual without Chinese domicile has a single departure exceeding 30 days during any calendar year in which they accumulate 183+ days of residence in China, the consecutive-year count for 183-day residence shall restart.

(2) The cumulative days in China shall be calculated based on physical presence. A full day (24+ hours) in China counts as one residence day; partial days shall not be counted.

2. Foreign individuals qualifying as tax residents may elect either special additional IIT deductions or tax exemptions for housing/language training/children's education subsidies. Such election shall be binding for the entire tax year and may not be altered (valid through December 31, 2027).

Tax Year

From January 1 to December 31 of the Gregorian calendar.

Calculation of Taxable Income

Individual income derived by resident individuals from China and overseas shall be subject to individual income tax pursuant to the provisions of this law. For a resident individual's comprehensive income, the taxable income shall be the amount remaining after deducting 60,000 yuan, special deductions, specific additional deductions and other deductions as prescribed by laws and regulations.

Income received by a non-resident individual from within China shall be subject to individual income tax pursuant to the provisions of this law. For the salary and wage income of non-resident individuals, the taxable income shall be the balance of the monthly income after deducting 5,000 yuan. For incomes from remuneration for personal services, author's remuneration, and royalties, the taxable income shall be the amount of each income.

Declaration Period

A taxpayer who derives taxable income without a withholding obligor shall duly submit the prescribed individual tax return and settle the corresponding tax liabilities with the competent tax authority no later than the 15th day of the month immediately following the month in which the income is accrued.

A resident individual who derives income from outside China shall file tax returns and make payments between March 1 and June 30 of the year following the year in which the income is obtained.

A non-resident individual who derives wages and/or salaries from two or more income sources within the territory of China shall duly file the prescribed individual income return and settle all outstanding tax liabilities with the competent tax authority no later than the 15th day of the month immediately following the month in which the income is accrued.

Social Insurance Enrollment Requirements for Foreigners in China

Foreigners covered in the social insurance system shall be entitled to social insurance benefits in China in accordance with the law once the qualifying conditions are met.

A foreigner working within the territory of China shall refer to a non-Chinese national who is in possession of an employment permit, such as Foreigner's Work Permit, or Press Card for Resident Foreign Correspondent, Residence Permit, or the Permanent Residence Permit of Foreigners, and is lawfully working within the territory of the People's Republic of China.

A foreigner working within the territory of China from a state which has signed a bilateral or multilateral social insurance agreement with China shall be governed by the said agreement with regard to his or her social insurance affairs.

Required Documents and Procedures for Insurance Enrollment

The employer of a foreigner or the foreigner himself may register for insurance through the social security online service hall or the social security agency with the Notification Letter for Foreigner's Work Permit or the electronic social security card. After verifying the work permit information, the social security agency will establish a social security number for the foreigner who meets the insurance requirements, and the social security card management service department will issue a physical social security card to him. Once the foreigner has applied for and obtained the physical card, the electronic social security card will provide standard services to him or her.

Employees who are nationals of countries that have signed bilateral or multilateral agreements (or agreements, hereinafter referred to as agreements) with China on social insurance premiums shall be exempted from the obligation to pay premiums for the specified insurance types within the prescribed period in accordance with the provisions of the agreement if they provide proof of participation in insurance issued by the agreement country within three months of obtaining employment documents in China in accordance with the law. For those who cannot provide proof of participation in insurance issued by the agreement country three months after obtaining employment documents in China in accordance with the law, social insurance premiums shall be collected in accordance with regulations and corresponding late payment fees shall be charged. For insurance types outside the agreement and those specified in the agreement beyond the prescribed period, they shall be required to pay social insurance premiums in accordance with regulations.

In principle, the age at which foreigners employed in China receive pension benefits shall comply with the relevant provisions of the current retirement age policy. Maternity insurance expenses incurred by foreigners in China shall be paid by the maternity insurance fund, and the specific measures shall be determined by the provinces, autonomous regions and municipalities directly under the Central Government.

Receiving Social Insurance Benefits

If a foreigner is employed, the employer shall, within 30 days from the date on which the employment certificate is handled, handle the social insurance registration for the foreigner. Typically, the social insurance agency will assign a social security number and issue a Social Security Card of the People's Republic of China (hereinafter referred to as the "Social Security Card"). Foreigners who participate in social insurance and meet the conditions shall enjoy social insurance benefits in accordance with the law. They may use their social security cards to access treatment at designated public hospitals in their area, purchase medicines at designated medical insurance pharmacies, and use their cards to cover a part of their medical expenses.

A foreigner who meets the statutory conditions for receiving a pension may enjoy pension insurance benefits in accordance with the law.

If a foreigner leaves China before reaching the prescribed age for receiving a pension, his or her personal social insurance account shall be retained, and if he or she returns to China for employment, the contribution period shall be calculated cumulatively.

If the social insurance relationship is terminated upon a written application of the foreigner, the balance in the foreigner's personal social insurance account may be paid to the foreigner in a lump sum.

When a foreigner dies, the balance in his or her personal social insurance account may be inherited in accordance with the law.

Tips

Foreigners receiving monthly social insurance benefits outside China shall undergo annual eligibility verification by submitting either a Proof of Survival issued by the Chinese embassy/consulate in their country of residence, or a document notarized by local authorities and authenticated by Chinese diplomatic missions, with the alternative option of completing online verification through designated platforms, while provisions in international treaties ratified by China shall take precedence where applicable.

Foreign nationals who legally enter the country shall undergo annual verification of their eligibility for social insurance benefits, which may be completed either through the designated online self-service platform in accordance with relevant regulations or by personally certifying their survival status at the local social insurance administration office.

Handling Labor Disputes

In case of labor disputes, individuals may either call China's national public service hotline 12333 or file a formal complaint with the local Human Resources and Social Security Bureau.

Foreigners lacking valid employment authorization are expressly excluded from protections under China's Labor Contract Law, particularly regarding unlawful termination provisions.

Start-ups & Investment

Foreign natural persons, enterprises or other organizations (collectively referred to as "foreign investors") may invest directly or indirectly in China.

Foreign investment projects shall undergo the approval or filing procedures. Projects within the scope of the Catalogue of Investment Projects Verified and Approved by the Government are subject to review and approval by relevant authorities, and projects outside the scope are required to be registered with the local government investment authorities.

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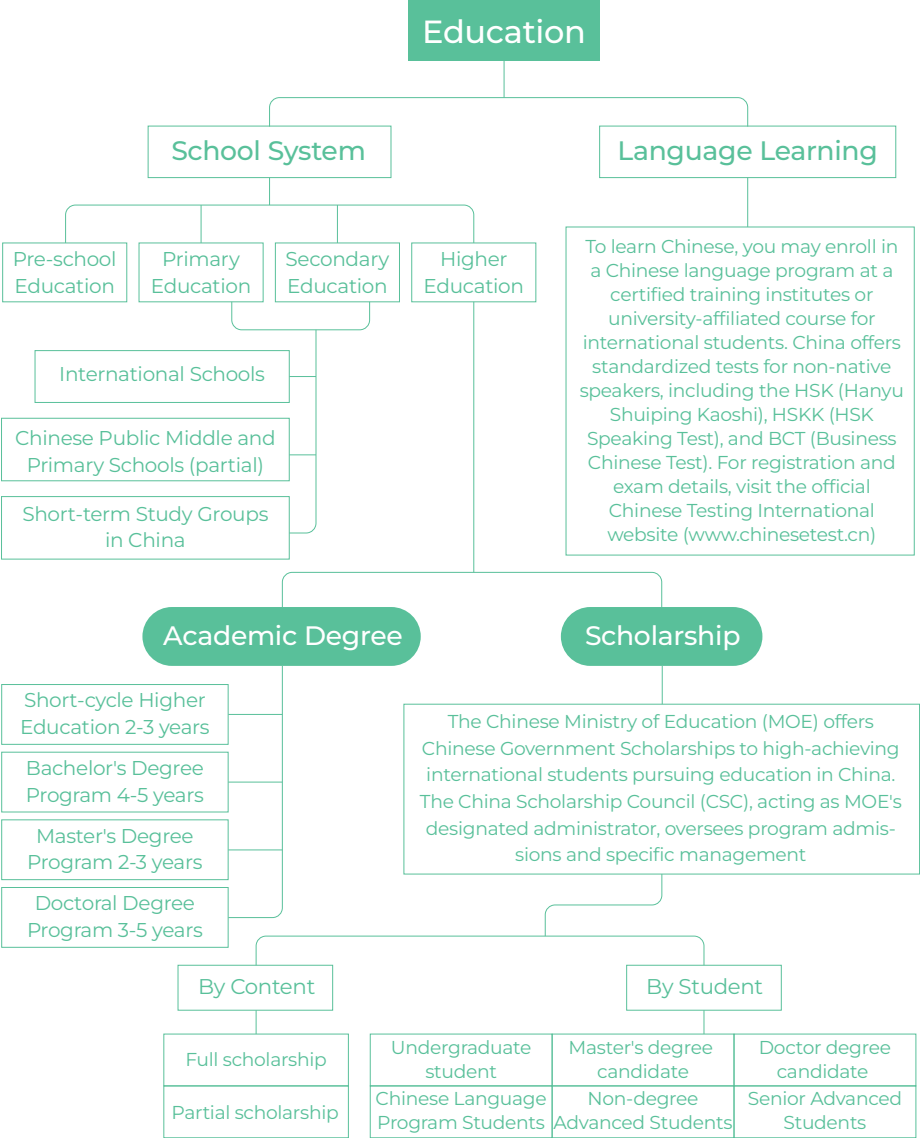

Study in China

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Education System Overview



Tips

Foreign students holding Chinese permanent residence status are entitled to access compulsory education and regular senior high school education in China. They shall register, enroll, and graduate in accordance with the requirements and processes prescribed by national and local education authorities.

Work-Study Conditions

Where a foreigner holding a residence permit for study intends to engage in off-campus work-study or internship, he or she shall, upon the approval of the school, apply to the exit and entry administration authority of the public security organ to have such information as the location and duration of the work-study program or internship placement specified in his or her residence permit. A foreigner holding a residence permit for study shall not engage in any off-campus work-study or internship unless the information prescribed in the preceding paragraph is specified in his or her residence permit.

[For details, please refer to the Regulations of the People's Republic of China on Administration of the Entry and Exit of Foreigners]

According to relevant regulations, foreign applicants for work-study programs in China must meet the following basic conditions:

- (1) They shall be at least 18 years old and meet the physical requirements for work-study positions;
- (2) They shall hold a valid residence permit for students in China with a remaining valid residence period of more than six months;
- (3) They shall abide by Chinese laws and regulations and school rules and regulations, have good conduct and performance, and have no criminal record or violation of regulations or disciplines;
- (4) They are undergraduate students/short-cycle higher education students, postgraduate students, students seeking advanced training, or research scholars who have studied in the current school for more than one year;
- (5) Their academic progress and attendance rate meet school requirements.

Furthermore, international students may only conduct work-study activities within the prefecture-level municipal jurisdiction of their host institution. The permitted working hours are strictly capped at 8 weekly / 40 monthly hours during semesters; 16 weekly / 80 monthly hours during vacations. Each work-study permit's validity shall not surpass either the student's residence permit duration or a maximum of 12 months.

According to Article 11 of the Regulations on Work-Study of International Students in Higher Education Institutions:

International students engaging in off-campus work-study must, within 10 days, submit an employment agreement, school certification letter, and supporting documents to the local Public Security Bureau's Exit-Entry Administration department to obtain a residence permit endorsement specifying the employer's details and authorized work period. Holding a residence permit without such endorsement prohibits participation in off-campus work-study activities.

International students who need to change their off-campus work-study employer or duration must, within 10 days, submit a new employment agreement and school certification letter to the local Public Security Bureau's Exit-Entry Administration department to apply for an update to their residence permit endorsement.

International students who terminate their off-campus work-study activities due to employer-initiated agreement termination or other circumstances must, within 10 days, submit a formal written notice to their host institution and complete the required endorsement updates with the local Public Security Bureau's Exit-Entry Administration department.



Illegal Employment and Penalties

Foreign students who violate the work-study management regulations by engaging in employment beyond the prescribed job scope or time limit shall be deemed as illegally employed.

Foreigners engaged in illegal employment, individuals/entities facilitating such employment, or employers illegally hiring foreigners may face penalties including fines ranging from 5,000 yuan to 100,000 yuan, detention for 5-15 days, or deportation, depending on the severity of the violation.

Scholarships

The Chinese Government Scholarship program sponsors outstanding international students and scholars for academic studies and research at Chinese higher education institutions. The Ministry of Education (MOE) has authorized the China Scholarship Council (CSC) to administer student recruitment and program management under this national scholarship framework.

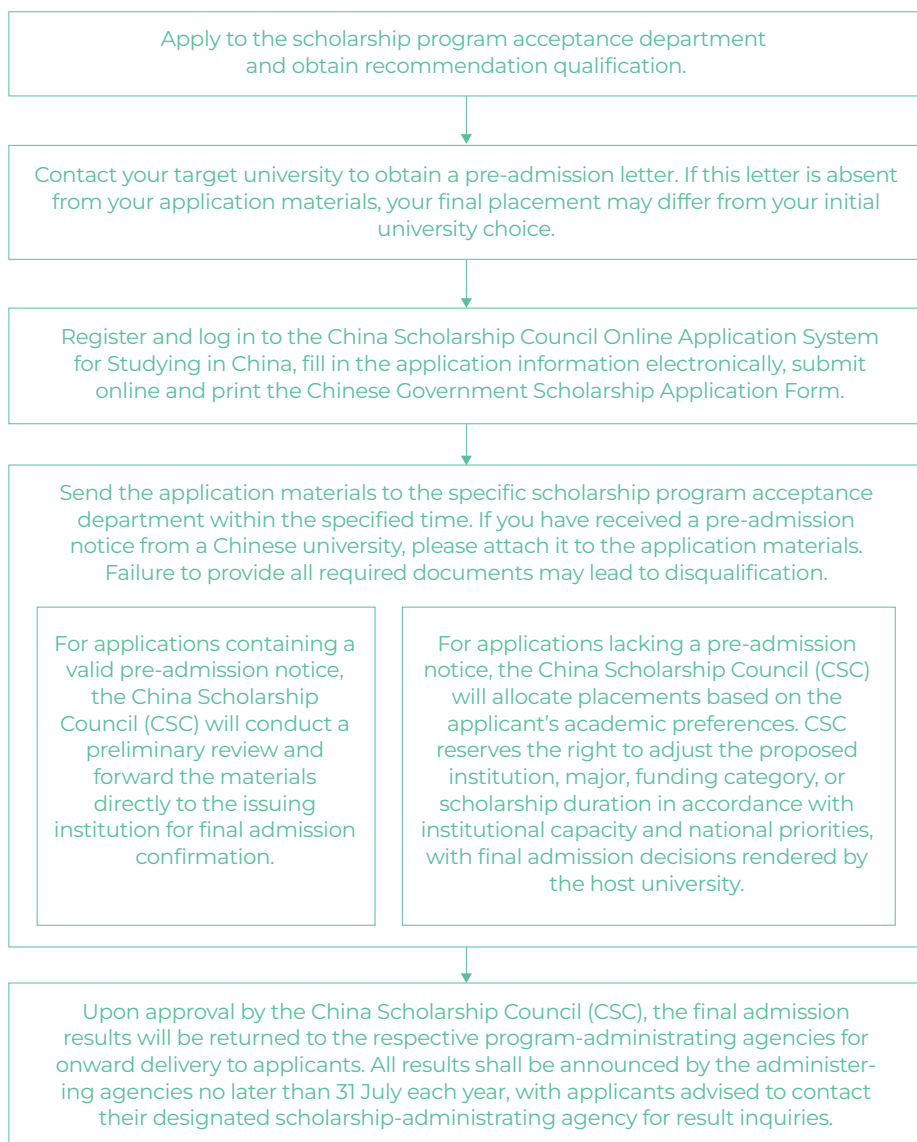
When to apply for the Chinese Government Scholarships? How to apply? What programs are available there?

The annual application window for the Chinese Government Scholarship Program runs from early January through early April. Applicants shall submit complete documentation directly to their designated application agencies (e.g., Chinese embassies or target universities). Program-specific requirements are detailed in the table below:

What is the application process for the Chinese Government Scholarships? What are the dos and don'ts?

The basic flow of applying for the Chinese Government Scholarship is shown in the flow chart below. The application process for each program is slightly different, so please refer to the details of each program.



What materials are required to apply for the Chinese Government Scholarships?

Generally, the following materials are required:

- (1) Application Form for Chinese Government Scholarship (filled in Chinese or English);
- (2) Notarized certificate of highest academic qualification;
- (3) Academic transcripts of the institution you attended before coming to China;
- (4) Plans for study or research in China;
- (5) Letter of recommendation;
- (6) Students applying for music majors must submit a CD of their works, while students applying for fine arts majors must provide a CD of 2 sketches, 2 color paintings, and 2 other pieces;
- (7) Applicants under the age of 18 must submit relevant legal documents of their legal guardians in China;
- (8) Applicants who come to China to study for more than 6 months shall submit a photocopy of the Foreigner Physical Examination Form;
- (9) Pre-admission letter issued by the designated host university;
- (10) If you have obtained an HSK score report, please also attach a photocopy of it with the application materials. All application materials must be compiled in the specified sequence above and bound at the top-left corner into two identical sets. Original documents will not be returned.



Is it a must to study in Chinese to apply for the Chinese Government Scholarships?

The Chinese Government Scholarship undergraduate programs are exclusively delivered in Chinese. Scholarship recipients pursuing bachelor's degrees must complete a one-year preparatory study at designated institutions. Formal degree studies may commence only after passing the preparatory assessment.

For graduate and advanced studies, Chinese is generally the language of instruction, though some institutions offer English-taught programs in specific disciplines (detailed information available at <http://www.campuschina.org>).

Scholarship recipients opting for Chinese-taught programs with insufficient Chinese proficiency must complete 1-2 years of mandatory language training before beginning degree studies, contingent upon meeting their host university's admission standards; failure to comply will result in termination of scholarship eligibility. Specifically, students in STEM, economics, management, law, or arts disciplines require 1 year of Chinese study, while those in humanities, history, philosophy, or traditional Chinese medicine programs may need up to 2 years, with exemptions granted to students in English-taught programs or those already meeting Chinese proficiency requirements.

Can applicants apply for Chinese Government Scholarships directly from Chinese universities?

Only Chinese universities that undertake the University Program can accept scholarship applications from applicants. For a list of universities under the program, please visit <http://www.csc.edu.cn/studyinchina> or <http://www-w.campuschina.org>.

Can applicants apply for more than one scholarship program?

Yes, but if an applicant is recommended for admission by multiple programs or multiple schools, their scholarship eligibility will only be retained for one program or one school.

How to check the scholarship admission results?

Each scholarship program acceptance department will announce the final admission results before July 31 each year. Applicants can check the admission results with the scholarship program acceptance department they applied for.

Chinese Proficiency Test (HSK)	The Chinese Proficiency Test (HSK) is an international standardized examination administered under the International Chinese Language Proficiency Framework and HSK Test Specifications. It assesses non-native speakers' ability to utilize Chinese in daily, academic, and professional contexts. HSK results serve as: Mandatory proof of language proficiency for international students applying to Chinese institutions or scholarships; Official language credential for foreigners seeking employment, permanent residency, or immigration status in China. Chinese Proficiency Oral Test (HSKK)	This examination assesses oral Chinese proficiency of non-native speakers through three levels: HSKK (Elementary), HSKK (Intermediate), and HSKK (Advanced). It tests their ability to communicate in Chinese with patients, medical staff and related personnel in medical/healthcare scenarios. 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Hotel Accommodation

Accommodation Registration

In accordance with the Regulations on Public Security Administration of the Hotel Industry, all foreign nationals entering China shall register for accommodation.

Hotels shall conduct mandatory guest registration. During the registration, they shall check the guests' identity documents and register all required information truthfully as prescribed by relevant regulations.

When accommodating foreign nationals, hotels shall additionally submit an accommodation registration form to the local public security agency within 24 hours.

Non-Hotel Accommodation

Foreign nationals residing or staying in accommodations other than hotels shall complete registration procedures with the local public security organ at the place of residence within 24 hours after check-in, either by themselves or through their host.

Foreign nationals failing to register for accommodation according to the regulations would be given a warning and may concurrently face a fine not exceeding 2,000 yuan. After accepting the punishment at the local public security organ, the foreign national shall bring his/her passport, the host's household registration booklet, and other required materials to apply for delayed accommodation registration and fill in a temporary accommodation registration form.

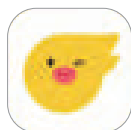

Scenic Area Overview

China boasts a total of 339 5A-level scenic spots and 57 world heritage sites, making it the country with the most diverse World Heritage categories in the world. It is also one of the countries with the highest number of mixed cultural and natural heritage sites.

Palace Museum (5A) Beijing



The Palace Museum in Beijing was established in 1925, based on the imperial palaces and collections of the Ming (1368–1644) and Qing (1655–1911) dynasties. It is a comprehensive national museum and also the largest ancient Chinese cultural and art museum. The majority of its cultural relics originate from the former collections of the Qing Dynasty palace.

Badaling Great Wall (5A) Beijing



The Badaling Great Wall is located in Yanqing District, northwest of Beijing. It is an outstanding representative of the Great Wall of China and the most complete and well-preserved section of the Great Wall. As the earliest open Great Wall scenic area, it is considered the essence of the Ming Great Wall. There is a famous Chinese saying: "He who has never been to the Great Wall is not a true man". The Badaling section is a popular choice for a tour of the Great Wall.

Summer Palace (5A) Beijing



The Summer Palace is located in the west of Beijing and was a royal garden during the Qing Dynasty. Based on Kunming Lake and Wanshou Hill and modeled after the West Lake in Hangzhou, it incorporates design techniques of the famous gardens of Jiangnan (regions south of the lower reaches of the Yangtze River). It is a large-scale landscape garden and the best-preserved royal garden in China, known as the Royal Garden Museum.

Temple of Heaven (5A) Beijing



The Temple of Heaven is the largest existing ancient architectural complex for worshipping heaven in the world. It served as the site where emperors of the Ming and Qing dynasties performed rituals to worship heaven and pray for good harvests. Located in the central area of Beijing, the Temple of Heaven is a masterpiece of ancient Chinese architecture and was inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage List in 1998.



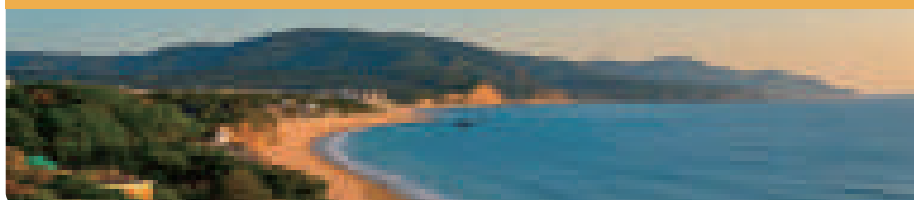
Shanhaiguan (5A) Qinhuangdao in Hebei



Shanhaiguan (Shanhai Pass) is located in the northeast part of Qinhuangdao City, Hebei Province. It is one of the most important passes in the eastern section of the Ming Great Wall and was constructed during the Ming Dynasty. Adjacent to the Yanshan Mountains in the north and facing the Bohai Sea in the east, Shanhaiguan is a well-preserved city gate with a complete defense system. It served as a crucial military fortress in ancient China and is famously known as the First Pass Under Heaven (Tianxia Diyi Guan).



Beidaihe (4A) Qinhuangdao in Hebei



Beidaihe Scenic Area is located on the eastern coast of Beidaihe District, Qinhuangdao City, Hebei Province. It is one of the four major summer resorts in China. The area features more than 6,600 hectares of forest and over 50 mu (3,333 hectares) of wetlands. The mudflats, lagoons, and slow-moving rivers formed at the mouths of the Daihe and Henghe rivers are listed as international wetlands. Known as the Beidaihe Wetland under the Convention for the Protection of Natural Resources, it is a famous bird-watching destination.

Jingyuetan (5A) Changchun in Jilin



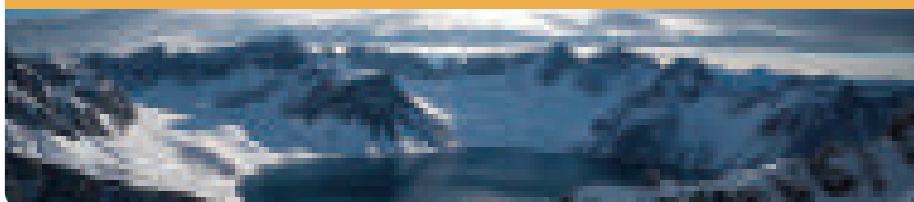
Jingyuetan National Scenic Area located in Changchun, Jilin Province, is a national scenic spot, a national forest park, and a national fitness center. The scenic area covers an area of 96.38 square kilometers, including a water area of 5.3 square kilometers and a forest coverage rate of up to 96%. Known as the "Pearl of the Green Sea" and "Urban Oxygen Bar", it is the ecological green core and city card of Changchun.

Palace Museum of the Manchurian Regime (5A) Changchun in Jilin



The Palace Museum of the Manchurian Regime was once the residence of Puyi, the last emperor of the Qing Dynasty, during his reign as the puppet emperor of the so-called "Manchukuo" from 1932 to 1945. Today, the museum has been restored to reflect the environment in which Puyi lived and worked, displaying a large number of historical documents and cultural relics that provide insights into the life of the last emperor.

Changbai Mountain (5A) Changbai Mountain in Jilin



Changbai Mountain, located on the border between China and North Korea in Baishan City, Jilin Province, is a dormant volcano. The Tianchi (Heavenly Lake) at the summit of the main peak is a must-see attraction and a sacred place for prayers in the hearts of many visitors. The Changbai Mountain scenic area boasts a variety of natural wonders, including the Changbai Waterfall, Alpine Gardens, Jinjiang Grand Canyon, Forest Sea at the Valley Bottom, and Alpine Hot Springs.

Oriental Pearl Tower (5A) Shanghai



Oriental Pearl Tower, or "Oriental Pearl", is located in Lujiazui, Pudong New Area, Shanghai. It is one of the iconic buildings in Shanghai, integrating multiple functions such as urban sightseeing, trendy dining, shopping and entertainment, historical exhibitions, Huangpu River cruises, conferences and performances, as well as broadcasting and television transmission.



The Bund (5A) Shanghai



The Bund is located along the Huangpu River in Shanghai, stretching approximately 1.5 kilometers. The diverse architectural complexes of different countries and the enchanting night views of the Huangpu River are the highlights of this iconic area. The Bund features dozens of classically inspired buildings with distinct styles, including the renowned Bank of China Building, Peace Hotel, Customs House, and HSBC Building. These structures evoke the former splendor of the "Wall Street of the Orient".



Yu Garden (4A) Shanghai



Yu Garden, located in Huangpu District, Shanghai, is a classical Jiangnan garden originally built in the Ming Dynasty, with a history of more than 450 years. It embodies the artistic style of southern Chinese gardens during the Ming and Qing dynasties, characterized by its "elegant tranquility, exquisite delicacy, and exquisite craftsmanship". The garden also houses a significant number of ancient trees, famous Ming and Qing furniture, calligraphy and paintings by renowned artists, clay sculptures, brick carvings, plaques, and couplets, all of which are valuable cultural relics.

West Lake (5A) Hangzhou, Zhejiang



The West Lake, surrounded by mountains on three sides, showcases the artistic style of “poetic and picturesque” landscape design that has been emphasized in the East since the Southern Song Dynasty (1127-1279). Among its over 100 distinctive scenic spots, the Three Pools Mirroring the Moon, Spring Dawn at Su Causeway, Melting Snow at Broken Bridge, and Sunset Glow at Leifeng Pagoda are among the renowned “Ten Scenes of West Lake”. The West Lake has also served as a testament to the development and inheritance of China’s enduring cultural traditions, including Buddhism and Taoism, as well as the values of loyalty and filial piety, the pursuit of seclusion, book collection, tea meditation, and the study of seals.

Lingyin Temple (5A) Hangzhou, Zhejiang



Lingyin Temple was first built in the first year of the Xianhe era of the Eastern Jin Dynasty (the year 326 AD) and has a history of about 1,700 years. It is one of the oldest and most famous Buddhist temples in Hangzhou. With its unique and superior Buddhist culture, magnificent and grand temple architecture, and beautiful and serene natural scenery, Lingyin Temple attracts visitors from both home and abroad, becoming a renowned Buddhist destination for learning Buddhism, sightseeing, praying for blessings, and enjoying leisure.

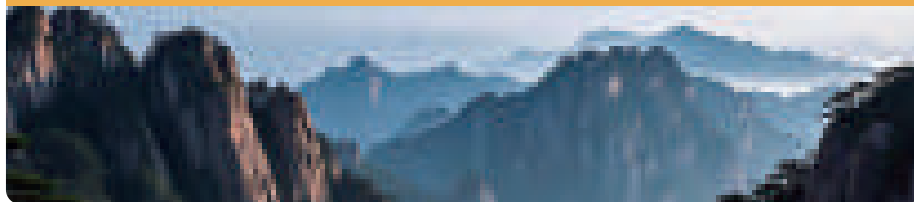
Liangzhu Ancient City Ruins Park (5A) Hangzhou, Zhejiang



The Liangzhu Ancient City was the power and belief center of an early regional state in the area around Lake Taihu in the lower reaches of the Yangtze River in China, dating back 5,300 to 4,300 years. The Liangzhu Ancient City Ruins consists of the core area of the ancient City, a water conservancy system, an altar cemetery and the outer suburbs, covering a total area of 100 square kilometers. The ruins are a testament to the 5,000-year history of Chinese civilization and were inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage List in 2019.



Mount Huangshan (5A) Huangshan, Anhui



The Huangshan Scenic Area is located in Huangshan City, Anhui Province. The unique pine trees, grotesque rocks, sea of clouds, and hot springs are known as the “Four Wonders” of Mount Huangshan. In addition to these, the rime ice, snowscapes, and sunrises are also must-see attractions for visitors. There is an old saying in China: “After returning from the Five Sacred Mountains, one won't bother to see other mountains; after returning from Mount Huangshan, one won't bother to see even the Five Sacred Mountains”.



Hongcun Village (5A) Huangshan, Anhui



Hongcun Village is located at the southwest foot of Mount Huangshan. It is representative of ancient villages of the Huizhou style, where cultural and natural landscapes are perfectly integrated. Known as the “Chinese Village in Paintings”, Hongcun Village is renowned for its unique water features brought by its ancient water system and the exquisitely detailed Huizhou-style “three carvings” (brick carving, stone carving, and wood carving) on its architecture, which resemble the finest Chinese paper-cuttings.



Wuyuan Huangling Village (5A)



Huangling Ancient Village, hanging on the cliff, is located in the Shier Mountain Range in Wuyuan County, Jiangxi Province. Covering an area of 7 square kilometers, the village is composed of several scenic areas, including aerial views via cable cars, ancient village exploration along Tianjie Street, terraced flower fields, and unique autumn-drying folk customs. It was rated by the United Nations World Tourism Organization as the “Best Village for Tourists” and was also praised by netizens as the “Most Beautiful Nostalgia Experience Destination” for its unique charm and rich cultural heritage.



Confucius Temple (5A) Qufu, Shandong



The Confucius Temple in Qufu, also known as the Temple of the Most Sacred, is the original temple dedicated to the worship of Confucius in Chinese history and is one of the largest Confucian temples in the world. Along with the Forbidden City in Beijing and the Mountain Resort in Chengde, it is recognized as one of China's three major ancient architectural complexes. The Confucius Temple is not only a symbol of Confucian culture but also a model of ancient Chinese architectural art.



Mount Tai (5A) Tai'an, Shandong



Mount Tai is one of the oldest and most famous mountains in China, with a 10-kilometer-long ascent path featuring a flagpole every three li (1 li is 500 meters) and a memorial archway every five li, creating a magnificent and impressive sequence of steps leading to the summit. For nearly two thousand years, the solemn and sacred Mount Tai has been a site of worship for emperors. It has long been a source of inspiration for Chinese artists and scholars, symbolizing ancient Chinese civilization and beliefs.



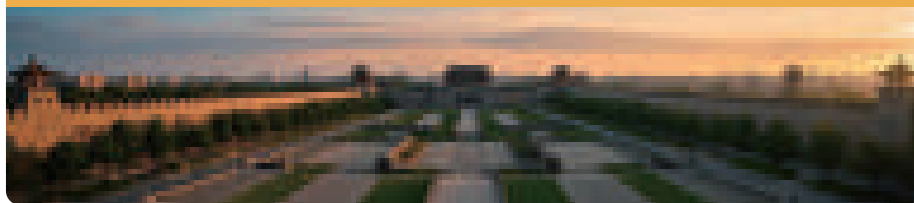
Emperor Qinshihuang's Mausoleum Site Museum (Terracotta Army Museum) (5A) Xi'an, Shaanxi



Emperor Qinshihuang's Mausoleum Site Museum is a large-scale heritage museum based on the Qinshihuang's Terracotta Warriors and Horses Museum and the Qinshihuang's Mausoleum Site Park. The Qin Terracotta Warriors and Horses pits were discovered in 1974 and hailed as the "Eighth Wonder of the World". The three pits are arranged in the shape of "品", covering a total area of more than 20,000 square meters. They contain over 7,000 life-sized terracotta figures and horses, which possess high artistic value.

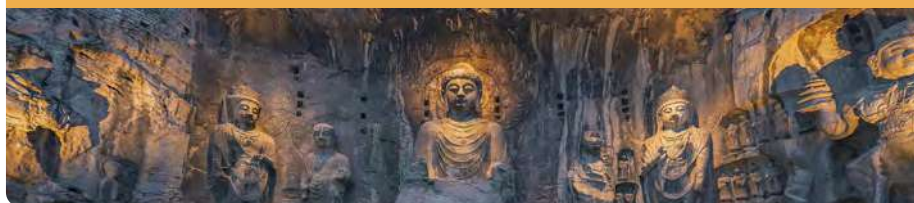
Daming Palace National Heritage Park (5A)

Xi'an, Shaanxi



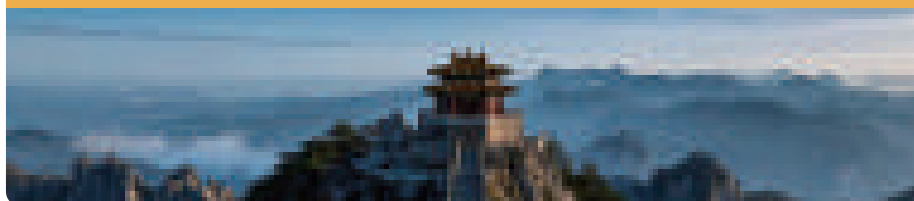
The Daming Palace is the most magnificent architectural complex among the royal palaces of the Tang Dynasty, located on the Longshouyuan in the northern part of Chang'an City (today's Xi'an). The Daming Palace National Heritage Park is the largest central park in Xi'an, featuring six highlights and ten typical tourist attractions.

Longmen Grottoes (5A) Luoyang, Henan



The Longmen Grottoes, inscribed on the World Heritage List, are divided into two parts—East Hill and West Hill—by the Yi River. The East Hill grottoes mainly feature works from the Tang Dynasty, while the West Hill grottoes, dating back to the Northern Dynasties and the Sui and Tang periods, are considered the essence of Longmen. This includes the Vairocana Buddha in Fengxian Temple and the "Twenty Best Inscriptions of Longmen" found in Guyang Cave.

Laojun Mountain (5A) Luoyang, Henan



The Laojun Mountain Scenic Area is said to be the place where Laozi (Li Er), the founder of Taoism, secluded himself for spiritual cultivation. A temple was built on the mountain during the Northern Wei Dynasty (386-534) to commemorate him, and it has been a popular pilgrimage site with a steady stream of worshippers ever since. The mountain is covered with lush trees and boasts picturesque scenery, with mountain springs visible throughout the area. In the golden autumn season, it becomes an ideal spot for admiring red leaves.

Canton Tower (4A) Guangzhou, Guangdong



Canton Tower, also known as the Guangzhou New TV Tower, stands at a total height of 600 meters, with the main tower body reaching 450 meters and the antenna mast extending an additional 150 meters. It is the third tallest tower in the world and the tallest in China. With its symmetrical top and bottom and a slender, elegant midsection, it is affectionately nicknamed the “Slim Waist”.

Chen Clan Ancestral Hall (4A) Guangzhou, Guangdong



The Chen Clan Ancestral Hall was completed in the 19th year of the Guangxu reign of the Qing Dynasty (1893). It was jointly funded and built by the Chen clansmen from various regions of Guangdong Province in Guangzhou as a clan ancestral hall. Integrating a variety of architectural decorative crafts from the Lingnan region, including wood carving, brick carving, stone carving, pottery sculpture, lime sculpture, copper and iron casting, and color painting, it is acclaimed as the “Pearl of Lingnan Architectural Art”. It is the largest, best-preserved, and most exquisitely decorated existing ancestral hall in China.

Lijiang River (5A) Guilin, Guangxi



The Lijiang River Scenic Area in Guilin is a quintessential representation of Chinese landscapes, featuring the typical karst topography. The Guilin landscapes, renowned worldwide for their “verdant mountains, clear waters, extraordinary caves, and exquisite rocks”, are celebrated as one of a kind in the world. The scenic area encompasses mountains, rivers, karst caves, and stone inscriptions, and has long enjoyed the reputation of having “the best landscapes under heaven”.

Hongya Cave (4A) Chongqing



The Hongya Cave, or Hongyadong, is centered around the traditional "stilt houses" of the Bayu region. These houses are built along the mountainside and along the river, following the natural terrain. It is an excellent place to wander through the old streets of the mountain city, enjoy the views of the two rivers, and savor local delicacies.

Chengdu Research Base of Giant Panda Breeding (4A) Chengdu, Sichuan



Chengdu Research Base of Giant Panda Breeding is a world-renowned center for the ex-situ conservation, scientific breeding, public education, and educational tourism of giant pandas. Covering an area of 1,000 acres, the base is famous for its efforts in protecting and breeding giant pandas, red pandas, and other endangered wildlife species unique to China.

Wuhou Shrine (4A) Chengdu, Sichuan



The Wuhou Temple in Chengdu was originally established in the year 223 AD. It is the only temple in China that jointly commemorates a monarch and his minister. As the most renowned memorial site for Zhuge Liang, Liu Bei, and the heroes of the Shu Han Kingdom (the year 221-263 AD), it is also the most influential Three Kingdoms Relics Museum in the world, hailed as the "Holy Land of the Three Kingdoms".

Mount Qingcheng (5A) Dujiangyan, Sichuan



Mount Qingcheng is a famous Taoist mountain in China and one of the birthplaces of Taoism in China. Facing the Chengdu Plain, it is surrounded by peaks that form a natural fortress and has deep and dense forests that remain evergreen all year round. Dozens of Taoist temples have been well preserved to this day.

Stone Forest (5A) Kunming, Yunnan



The Stone Forest Scenic Area is famous for its majestic, strange, dangerous, beautiful and secluded landscape. It is known as “the first wonder in the world” and is one of the most famous karst landform tourist destinations around the globe. The karst landform area of the Stone Forest covers more than 1,100 square kilometers, with a protected area of 350 square kilometers. It is hailed as a “Natural Museum of Karst Landforms” thanks to its diverse and well-preserved geological features.

Dianchi Lake (4A) Kunming, Yunnan



Dianchi Lake, also known as Kunming Lake, lies at an altitude of 1,886 meters above sea level and is the largest freshwater lake in Yunnan Province. It is often referred to as the “Pearl of the Plateau”. The lake is vast and shrouded in misty waves, creating a majestic and expansive view. Visitors can stroll along the lake, take a boat ride, and feed birds in winter. Climbing the Longmen (Dragon Gate) and overlooking Dianchi Lake is an exhilarating experience that refreshes the mind and spirit.

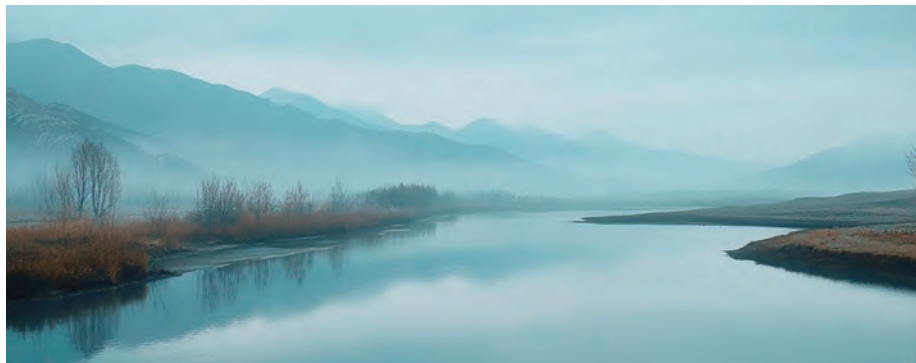

(1) Criminal suspects who are minors, blind, deaf-mute, or individuals with mental illness who have not completely lost the ability to recognize or control their own behavior, as well as individuals who may be sentenced to life imprisonment or the death penalty, are entitled to obtain designated legal aid if they have not appointed a defense lawyer;

(2) In the investigation stage and the review and prosecution stage, if a criminal suspect is unable to appoint a defense lawyer due to financial difficulties, or in the trial stage if a foreign national defendant has not appointed a defense lawyer, they are entitled to apply for legal aid;

(3) The beneficiary and the assigned defense lawyer shall have the right to obtain translation assistance.

Civil Cases

Foreign or stateless individuals applying for legal aid in China shall submit their applications to China's legal aid institutions in accordance with the conditions and procedures stipulated in international treaties to which their country of origin and China are both parties, in multilateral or bilateral judicial assistance treaties jointly signed, or based on the principle of reciprocity.

Legal Aid Center

12348 is a dedicated legal consultation hotline approved by the Ministry of Justice for citizens, with lawyers assigned by the Justice Bureau to staff it in shifts.



Traffic Accident

In the event of a road traffic accident occurring within the territory of China, the parties involved shall immediately report to the police. When handling road traffic accidents, the traffic control department of the public security authority shall inform the concerned parties of their respective rights and obligations during accident handling procedures as stipulated by Chinese laws, administrative regulations, and departmental rules.

Where a party bears full or primary liability for a road traffic accident, the entitled claimant for accident-related damages may petition the People's Court to adopt pre-litigation preservation measures. The court may lawfully implement compulsory measures including, but not limited to, the seizure of vehicles or relevant assets, and may additionally impose exit restrictions on the liable party. Following a road traffic accident, disputes concerning compensation for personal injury or property damage may be resolved through: private settlement between parties; application for administrative mediation; or initiation of civil proceedings.
